WITH THE NATIONALS coming to the West Coast this year, there was some thought that the Pacific Coast Sectional Championships would not receive as much attention as in other years. In fact, the Competitions Committee looked for a registration of under one hundred and so scheduled their allotted ice time.

But when registrations at deadline had reached an all time high of 136, schedules were hastily revised and still registrations ran on up to 143! But every member of the Committee worked with clocklike precision and when the curtain was rung down on Saturday night, with every award made to happy hearts, there were still a few minutes to go to eleven o'clock!

Thus on February 25, 26, and 27, at East Bay Iceland, the Pacific Coast Championships for 1954 passed into history, one of the most successful competitions in its annals. Never a dull moment here! With suspense all the way, competitors came from far behind in compulsory figure placements to gain better positions in the finals by their spectacular free skating performances. Probably the two most outstanding of these were Gloria Linek, jumping from eighth place in figures to second in the finals of the Junior Ladies' division, and little Linda Ann Epperson (last year's Pacific Coast Juvenile winner) coming from eighth place in figures to third in the finals of the Novice Ladies!

Until the final placings, figured under the feverish pencils of the harried accounting force, were posted, no contestant was sure of his position. The fiery, inspired performance of Catherine Machado in the Senior Ladies' class overcame the number one position held by Sherry Dorsey, although the latter's program and manner of performance seemed a winner.

This year for the first time appeared a new skating club from a new State when a small band of fine young skaters came from Salt Lake City to represent their club, the Utah Figure Skating Club, now in their first year of full membership in the United States Figure Skating Association. Among those who accompanied the young contestants were Mrs. George Baker, Club Secretary, Mrs. Frank Kennedy, Mrs. Kinsman, and Mr. James Cannon. I talked with them about the prospects for the new club and found that enthusiasm is keen and activity is at a high pitch. It looks like we are going to have some fine competition from them in the future. Best of luck to you, Utah FSC!

With the competition business all neatly wrapped up so early on Saturday, all the competitors, judges, officials, and their friends gathered shortly thereafter at a Supper Dance Party at the Athens Athletic Club in Oakland. Mrs. Margaret Bonnickson and Mrs. Alice Dockham were in charge of the party and again attendance was beyond all expectations; but the Club's Sunday larder was borrowed from so everybody had their fill.

And to show that he is as good at singing as at skating, our very popular young Toreador, Armando (Pancho) Rodriguez, entertained the crowd with a couple of well-received arias.

Interesting to note is the large number of entries in the upper classes which usually thin out near the top. Senior Ladies had a total registration of sixteen while Junior Ladies revealed fourteen entries. Unfortunately, though, the girls outnumbered the boys by better than three to one—and this in a sport that demands so much stamina and endurance!

The Novice Ladies' St. Moritz Perpetual Trophy (the only trophy in the Pacific Coast competition) went to Sally Gwaltney, whose fine performance won her the right of possession for the next year. This was won last year by LaRee Coyle who moved up into the Junior Ladies' class this year.

# Addition to USFSA Film Library

THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION for Infantile Paralysis has kindly donated to the USFSA a copy of the TV film featuring Tenley Albright. This film (black and white, 16 mm with sound) was taken last summer. (See News About Skaters, Skat-ING, November 1953.)

The film outlines some of the practice necessary to attain Tenley's level of achievement and traces the development of her skating program. It shows her practicing figures at the rink, doing exercises at home and at ballet class, listening to music for possible skating numbers and inspecting costumes with Mrs. Albright.

Her process of choreography is depicted: the noting of possible movements and the general paper work preparatory to actual performance on ice.

Tenley is shown at the Children's Hospital with youngsters afflicted with polio, and makes an appeal for contributions to the March of Dimes. The film also contains portions of two numbers skated by Tenley.

# Winter Sports Film

An all winter sports film, entitled Skyways to Holidays, has been made available for skating clubs, skiing clubs and winter sports organizations in general by K.L.M., Royal Dutch Airlines.

The 16 mm film shows in color and sound some of K.L.M.'s skating and skiing tours through Europe's Alps. It also includes part of the 1953 World Figure Skating Championships at Davos.

Thirty-five minutes long, the film can be obtained at no charge, except for transportation costs, by contacting the nearest K.L.M. Royal Dutch Airlines office. A first and second choice of play dates and the name and size of the group should be given.
