Changes come to SKATING magazine



Another season is underway, and it promises to be full of things that are new and different. As you learned last issue many things are changing around U.S. Figure Skating, and SKATING magazine is no exception. You may have noticed a new look in the October issue, but there are other changes as well.

Since I started working with U.S. Figure Skating almost a year ago, I've received many requests from SKATING readers. And we are trying to incorporate many of those suggestions into the magazine.

You've asked that we feature more skaters of all levels because skaters find inspiration in learning about other skaters. So we are working to find ways to feature a more diverse group of skaters in the pages of SKATING. As part of that effort a new department called On Track debuted in the October issue. So in this issue you'll find a fun feature about Susie Gharib, a television news anchor who finds a release from her stressful job on the ice. While Susie doesn't compete, she sets goals and sharpens her skating skills through U.S. Figure Skating's testing structure. She is currently working on the pre-gold dance tests and has passed on her love of skating to her 18-year-old daughter.

Here are some other changes we have planned for future issues of SKATING. We want to help you get to know the Headquarters staff better, so we'll begin featuring short profiles on Headquarters staff members. You'll find out who can help you with what, as well as what they enjoy doing outside of U.S. Figure Skating. You will also be able to track the progress figure skating is making in a new feature called "By the Numbers." In this area you'll find out things such as how many memberships were processed during a certain time period and how many hits the U.S. Figure Skating web site has received.

Another addition you may have noticed in the October issue is a new article called "Focus for Parents." This will appear four times a year to help inform parents about topics that concern them.

We are also now accepting submissions for our Synchronized Spotlight. So visit us online if you would like to see your team featured in this spot. This is just one example of how we will work more closely with the web site to give you more information and make becoming a part of SKATING magazine easier than ever.

This is the magazine of U.S. Figure Skating, and we want to meet as many of your requests as possible. So we ask that you keep the ideas coming. What do you want see in the magazine? Who would you like to see featured? What types of articles would help you improve your skating? Do you know someone with an interesting or inspiring skating story? Let us know.

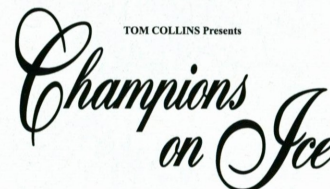

know an individual within the skating community who exemplifies Jimmy's spirit, send a one-page nomination letter describing the following:

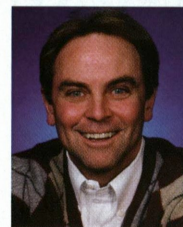

At the 78th annual Middle Atlantic Championships Sept. 18–21, 2003, all novice and junior gold medalists were awarded prize money in memory of Sears.

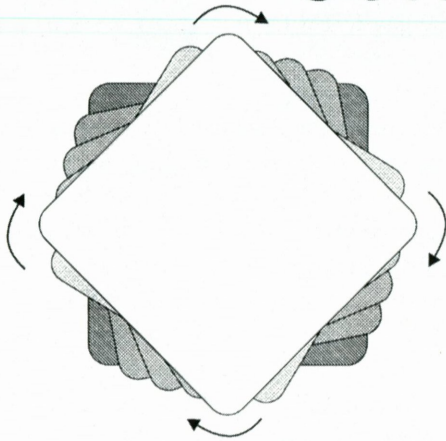

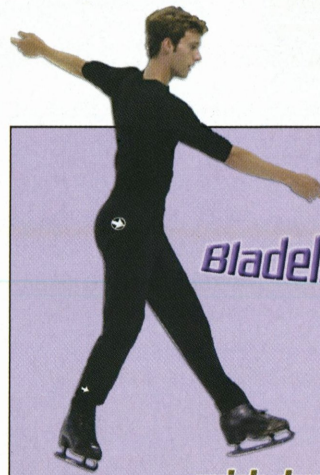

Chevy/U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Program **BREAKS RECORD**

The numbers are in, and the Chevy/U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Program has done it again! The program registered 106,234 members in the 2002–2003 season, marking the second straight year the program has registered at least 100,000 members. The totals for 2002–2003 broke the program's all-time record by more than 5,000 members. The old record was set during the 2001–2002 season.

The Basic Skills program, first established in 1985, offers people of all ages the opportunity to learn the fundamentals of ice skating taught by professionally-trained instructors across the United States. The program, which consists of eight different curriculums, is designed to instruct all levels of skaters in proper technique through individual programs designed for preschool, basic skills, hockey, adult, free skate, dance, synchronized team skating and choreography.

Since 1985, U.S. Figure Skating has enrolled more than one million skaters between the ages of 3–94 in the Basic Skills program. There are 915 registered Basic Skills programs.

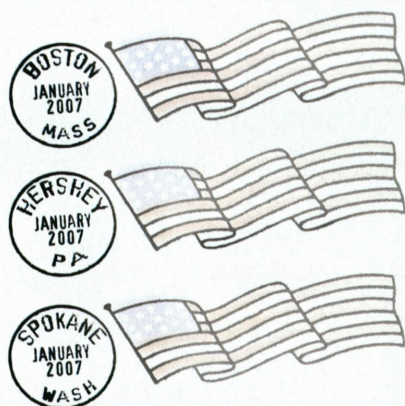
In 2002–2003 Wollman Ice Arena in New York, N.Y., had the best year of all. Although Wollman, an outdoor facility, is only in business for five months during the year, the program

registered more than 1,900 skaters!

Thanks to all the Basic Skills programs, program coordinators and area representatives who made the season an outstanding success, including Basic Skills Subcommittee Chair Paula Wagener, Vice Chair Roland Bessette and Director of Membership Development Susi Wehrli.

THREE CITIES named finalists to host 2007 U.S. Championships

In September, U.S. Figure Skating announced the three finalist cities vying to host the 2007 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships. The finalists are Boston, Mass.; Hershey, Pa.; and Spokane, Wash.

The U.S. Figure Skating Championships, held since 1914, is the nation's most prestigious figure skating event. The competition crowns a total of 12 U.S. champions in ladies and men's singles, pairs and ice dancing. Events are held in three divisions – championship (senior), junior and novice.

The 2007 U.S. Championships will attract approximately 1,500 figure

skating athletes, coaches and officials to the selected city.

The city of Boston has hosted a total of six U.S. Championships in the past and most recently hosted the 2001 U.S. Championships, which attracted a record attendance of 122,131 for the eight-day event. The Boston bid for the 2007 event was presented by The Skating Club of Boston and the Greater Boston Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Hershey hosted the first U.S. Figure Skating pro-am event in 1992, and the Hershey Figure Skating Club has successfully hosted a variety of U.S. Figure Skating events. Most recently Hershey hosted the 1996 South Atlantic Regional Championships, and its club members were involved in the 1998 U.S. Championships in Philadelphia, Pa. Hershey's bid for the 2007 U.S.

Championships was presented by the Hershey Figure Skating Club and the Hershey-Capital Regional Visitors Bureau.

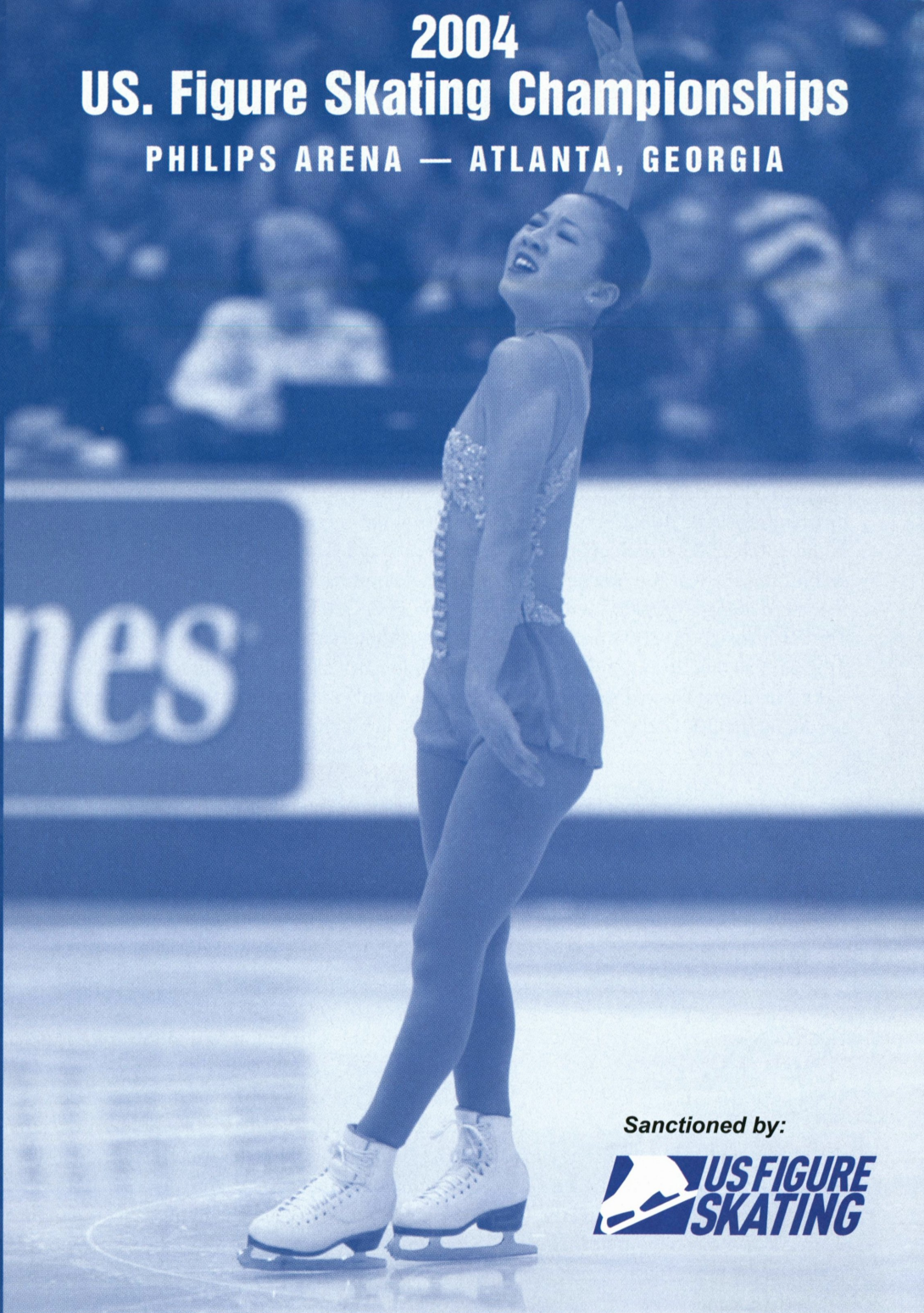
Spokane successfully hosted Smart Ones Skate America in 2002 at the Spokane Arena. The event established a new attendance record of 28,664 for the four-day event. Spokane's 2007 bid was presented by the Lilac City Figure Skating Club, Inland Northwest Figure Skating Club and STAR USA.

The bid process for the 2007 U.S. Championships began in March. Following site visits in September, the chair of the site selection team presented a final recommendation to U.S. Figure Skating's Board of Directors at its fall meeting in Colorado Springs, Colo., Oct. 31–Nov. 1. The 2004 U.S. Championships will be held in Atlanta, Ga., Jan. 3–11, 2004. Future U.S. Championships will be held in Portland, Ore., in 2005 and St. Louis, Mo., in 2006.

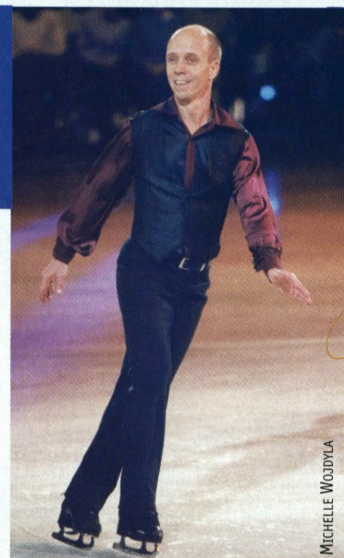

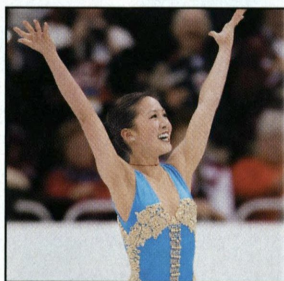

 Ann Patrice McDonough was only 3 when she started skating, but she knew right away what she liked most about the sport. She liked the idea of performing in front of an audience and hearing her program music over the rink speakers. Most of all, she liked to compete.

meant to skate

McDonough is 18 now and her tune hasn't changed. She remains a fierce competitor and is beginning to establish herself as one of the top skaters in the United States. And instead of skating in front of small crowds at public sessions, she's grabbing the attention of audiences at major competitions around the world.

"I like competing better than I like training," said McDonough, the 2002 World Junior champion who finished fourth at the 2003 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships. "I just like the rush of going out there on the ice when there's a crowd and they clap."

McDonough, who was born in Korea and moved to the United States when she was 14 months old, began skating at public sessions at the rink that used to be part of the Broadmoor hotel in Colorado Springs, Colo. McDonough, known by her close friends as "A.P.," had been roller skating before and jumped at the chance to figure skate when her mother took her by the hotel one day.

"She saw the ice and said, 'Mommy, can I do that, too?'" said McDonough's mother, Julie.

Julie, who grew up in a small town in Korea and had never been ice skating before, said she wasn't sure what she was starting that afternoon at the Broadmoor. But it quickly became apparent that her daughter was meant to be on the ice. Shortly after McDonough began public lessons, she was stroking around the rink herself.

"I can do this myself," she would tell her mom. "Don't hold me anymore."

Six months later, McDonough enrolled in private lessons. It wasn't long before she started gaining attention from older, more experienced skaters.

gaining attention

Damon Allen, a former U.S. junior champion who was training in Colorado Springs, first took notice of McDonough when she was about 6.

"I noticed an ability in her right away," said Allen, who coaches McDonough along with Tom Zakrajsek at the World Arena.

McDonough started winning lower-level competitions. By the time she was 15, she won the U.S. junior title in 2000 in Cleveland. The following year, she placed seventh in her first trip to the U.S. Championships on the senior level and placed second at the World Junior Championships. She won the World Junior title in 2002.

This past season she won her first medal at a senior ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Series event, a silver at Skate America (finishing runner-up to Michelle Kwan). She just missed earning a spot on the World Team, placing fourth at the U.S. Championships in Dallas in a stacked field that featured Kwan, Olympic champion Sarah Hughes and former Olympian Sasha Cohen.

"I never guessed I'd be in this position now," McDonough said.

a strong mind and body

Those who know McDonough well, however, are not all that surprised by her rise to success. Her work ethic, combined with innate talent and a strong competitive nature, has gotten her to the position she is in now.

She skates four 45-minute sessions daily and also takes a power-skating class and goes to ballet once a week. In her little spare time, she's taking one class at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. McDonough, by the way, graduated one year early from Cheyenne Mountain High School in June 2002.

"I don't do anything outside of skating," McDonough said. "Sometimes it's difficult, but other times, I look back on what I've done and it's worth it."

At practices, McDonough is focused. Zakrajsek said it's not unusual for her to skate her program repeatedly during sessions or try technically demanding jumps over and over.

"She has a real intensity on the ice," he said.

It's that concentration that has helped her skate well even when the pressure is equally intense.

"A lot of people go to psychologists and try to get a strong mind," Julie said. "I don't think that works. I think you're born with it, and Ann Patrice has always been that way."

a return to what she knows

McDonough has made a concerted effort this past off-season to make sure she's ready for the next step in her career: making it to the top. At first she thought the right move was to split from

Zakrajsek, who had worked with her for nearly six years, and train instead with Christy Krall, a veteran coach and a 1964 Olympian.

After working with Krall for just a few months, McDonough decided to return to Zakrajsek. The week before Labor Day, she was back with her old coach. She said she had an amicable split with Krall and it was relatively easy to return to work with Zakrajsek.

"The training program was different," McDonough said of working with Krall. "And I liked the old way better, I guess. Going back, it's like I never left."

Zakrajsek, who had been McDonough's head coach for about 3½ years, ●

said he's excited to work with the young skating star again.

"I think the time away was good," Zakrajsek said. "I don't see it as a bad thing. When she left, I said she had a great talent and was a beautiful skater. If I wasn't coaching her, I would still feel the same way."

something new

That wasn't the only change for McDonough this summer. She also spent 10 days in Newington, Conn., working with Nikoli Morozov, who has become one of the sport's premier coaches and choreographers having trained Canadian World champion ice dancers Shae-Lynn Bourne and Viktor Kraatz, and Russian Olympic champion Alexei Yagudin.

McDonough first spoke with Morozov during the U.S. Championships in Dallas about having him choreograph her 2003–2004 season programs. McDonough loved Morozov's trademark fast-paced footwork and was impressed by the programs he had created for several elite skaters.

McDonough and her mother flew to Connecticut in July. They initially planned to spend a week there to have Morozov work on McDonough's free skate but decided to stay a few extra days so that he could design her short program as well. McDonough's free skate is to *Swan Lake*. Originally, McDonough planned to skate her short program to "Send in the Clowns," but Morozov decided to change the program music to *Spartacus*.

After seeing McDonough perform the programs in practice recently, Zakrajsek was in awe.

"I think she's a different skater," Zakrajsek said. "She has a lot more speed, power and drama."

competing with the best

McDonough unveiled her new free skate at the Campbell's International Figure Skating Classic in New York City



in early October (see article on page 18). McDonough hopes that her work with Morozov will help her compete against the big stars.

"I really enjoyed working with him," McDonough said. "He's such a good technician and choreographer. It was much harder training in Connecticut. Everything was longer, faster, higher."

By the end of her trip, McDonough was exhausted.

"Yeah," she said with a laugh. "I was pretty beat."

But the trip was well worth the fatigue. "He is one of the most incredible

coaches," Julie said. "He has so much passion, and he loves what he's doing. With him, nothing is ever good enough and there's always more that can be improved."

"He is expensive, but I feel like I owe him even more," Julie said.

The payoff will come later. McDonough is scheduled to compete in two Grand Prix events this fall — the Cup of China in Beijing, Nov. 5–9, and the Cup of Russia in Moscow, Nov. 19–23.

The first chance McDonough has of facing Kwan and Cohen in head-to-head competition is at the U.S. Championships

Jan. 3–11, 2004, in Atlanta. Kwan has opted to skip the Grand Prix season. Cohen will skate in Skate America, Skate Canada and Trophée Lalique.

Still, McDonough knows that to be among the best in the sport, she will have to beat skaters of that caliber at some point. McDonough has spent a good portion of the summer working on triple-triple jump combinations – maneuvers that helped turn Tara Lipinski and Sarah Hughes into Olympic champions.

a one-track mind

At press time, Zakrajsek had only been reunited with McDonough for a few days, but he already had big plans for her. Among those goals are trying to get a triple-triple into her free skate.

McDonough has practiced triple Lutz-triple toes, triple flip-triple toes and triple loop-triple loops, but she has never landed any of those difficult combinations in competition. Zakrajsek wouldn’t say exactly when McDonough might try one of those combinations this season, but he’s optimistic that it will be sometime soon.

“It’s definitely a skill that she can and will do,” Zakrajsek said.

McDonough said she is hoping this season will be a breakthrough year, one in which she will be considered among America’s elite skaters. She and Zakrajsek have set high goals for the season – contending for the title at the U.S. Championships, qualifying for the Grand Prix Final and earning a trip to the World Championships March 22–28, 2004, in Dortmund, Germany.

All three of those goals were within reach last season. McDonough likely would have made the Grand Prix Final had she not encountered visa problems en route to the Cup of Russia, and she was one spot away from making the 2003 World Team. (Two judges at the U.S. Championships placed her third in the free skate, ahead of Cohen, but McDonough had finished a disappointing sixth in the short program).

“I think it’s tough to beat people with big names,” McDonough said. “But if you skate well enough, they have to reward that.”

McDonough’s one-track mind just might help her reap those rewards.

She was thrilled with her performance in the free skate at the 2003 U.S. Championships. She landed seven triples but trimmed a double Axel into a single. The mistake was costly, but McDonough recovered beautifully.

“I was so excited that I did my best at that moment,” said McDonough, who pumped her fists into the air with joy after completing her routine. “The result didn’t matter.”

Cohen, Plushenko Win Campbell's Classic

The 2003–2004 season got underway Oct. 3 with the Campbell's International Figure Skating Classic held at Madison Square Garden in New York City. Most skaters debuted new programs and are still working out the kinks. But a solid performance by Sasha Cohen gave her a win over the three reigning ladies World medalists.

Ladies

Cohen's well-balance performance to Tchaikovsky's "Swan Lake" was packed with six triples – three to start the program, including a triple flip-double toe combination, and three near the end of the program. Her only problems were a slip on the landing of her double Axel, which she managed to hang on to, and a two-footed landing on her triple flip. Her technical scores were all 5.8s and her presentation scores were 5.9s across the board.

"It was a good start to the season," Cohen said. "I feel like we're picking up where we left off last season. It wasn't perfect, but it was great to put it all together in Madison Square Garden and have fun."

Cohen beat out 2003 World medalists Michelle Kwan, Elena Sokolova and Fumie Suguri for the win. Kwan placed second in the competition while Suguri and Sokolova placed fifth and sixth, respectively.

After now training a full year with Tatiana Tarasova, Cohen said she feels she has been improving by leaps and bounds, and that every competition helps with that improvement. Cohen said beating Kwan tells her she's doing something right.

"I've looked up to Michelle for a long time knowing that she's someone I can learn something from, so I've been paying

attention," Cohen said. "She's been at the top of her game for so many years for a reason. This means that I've gotten to that level."

Kwan, who placed second skating to "Tosca" by Giacomo Puccini, said she was breaking in new boots and perfecting her programs. Early in the program Kwan struggled with the landing of a triple Lutz that was meant to be a combination with a double toe. Late in the program she popped a Lutz that was a planned triple.

"During the program I was thinking, 'I need to work on this, and I need to work on that,'" she said. "I don't feel comfortable yet, but as the season gets going I'll be more at ease."

Kwan said she is still looking at the season and will decide what she will do as the season goes on. She said her decisions would be based on how she feels.

"That worked last year," she said. "I've been at 10 Worlds, and the question is how many is enough. I still love competing. I work hard in practice for what I get out there. You practice and think 'the crowd goes wild,' but there's nothing like it when it happens."

Ann Patrice McDonough, who also skated to "Swan Lake," placed third. She fell on her triple toe but completed a triple Salchow, triple flip and double Axel. She fought for the landings on her other

jumps, including a triple Lutz and a triple flip that she had planned as a combination jump.

The fourth through sixth place ladies struggled. Two falls left Jennifer Kirk, who replaced Irina Slutskaya at the competition, in fourth place. Her program to "Die Flaudis" included seven planned triples, including one triple-triple combination. She completed four triples but doubled

the second jump of her planned triple-triple combination.

Suguri of Japan, the 2003 World bronze medalist, fought on almost every element in her program. She struggled with her jumps – falling, stepping out of landings, or putting her hands down. She also stumbled during her footwork sequence. Her technical scores ranged from 4.9–5.3, and her presentation scores ranged from 5.2–5.6.

Current World silver medalist Sokolova of Russia also struggled on her technical elements stumbling out of jumps and two-footing landings. Her scores were the lowest of the competition with technical ranging from 4.5–5.1 and presentation ranging from 5.1–5.5.

men

Evgeny Plushenko gave a rousing performance of his “St. Petersburg” program from last season. He landed two quad toes, including one in combination with a double toe. Still he fought for a couple of landings, one on the second jump of the toe combination. He struggled a bit on his second combination, too, taking extra steps between his triple Axel-double toe.

Goebel debuted a new program to “Queen Symphony” by Tolga Kashif and placed second. He opened the program with a triple Axel-double toe-triple toe, but stepped out of the landing on the last jump. The program included eight triples but no quads. He said he plans to include

quads in this season’s programs, but the number will depend on the event. Under the new code of points judging system, which will be used at Smart Ones Skate America, Goebel said he would probably include one or two quads. But at events using the 6.0 judging system, he may include three.

“It felt good to get the program out there,” he said. “It was a good start, and it shows me what I need to work on and where I need to go.”

Michael Weiss finished third with a patriotic number skated to a medley of “When Johnny Comes Marching Home,” “Amazing Grace” and the “Battle Hymn of the Republic.” Despite a fall and a step out, Weiss was proud of the program, which was influenced by the new judging system.

“I think it’s more interesting,” Weiss said. “This program is not just one jump into the next. It’s nicely spaced. The closing was good tonight, and now I just need to smooth out the opening and make it solid.”

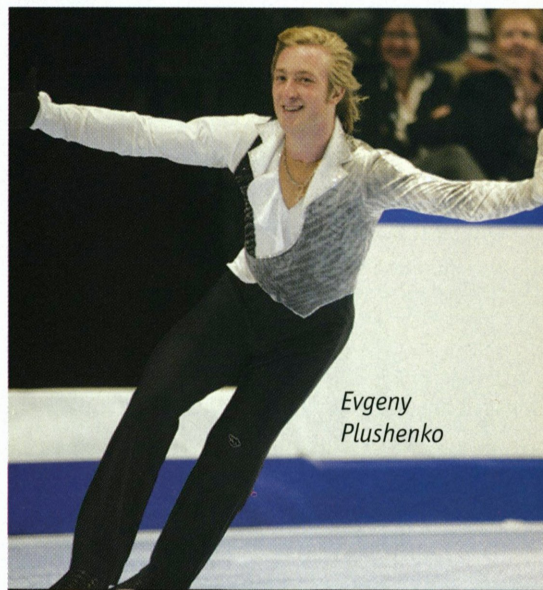
The final three men tied for fourth place. Ryan Jahnke skated to *Dancar Brasileiro*, a native Brazilian dance. His program included nine planned triples, but he struggled with his jumps.

Takeshi Honda of Japan skated to “Warsaw Concerto.” His technical scores were low, ranging from 5.0–5.3, mainly because of falls on attempted quad and triple jumps. His presentation scores were higher, ranging from 5.3–5.6.

Scott Smith, invited to participate when Alexei Yagudin withdrew from the event, was also part of the three-way tie for fourth. He skated to “Concerto for Saxophone” by Michael Kamen. He fell on a quad Salchow attempt and struggled with the landings on a triple Lutz and a triple Axel.

Most people attributed the mistakes seen at the event to this being the first competition of the season. When asked if Oct. 3 was too early to start the season, Weiss laughed and said no.

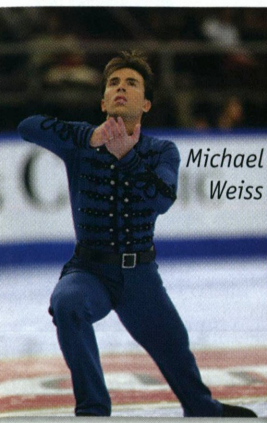
“It’s a great time to start,” he said. “No matter when it starts, it has to start.”



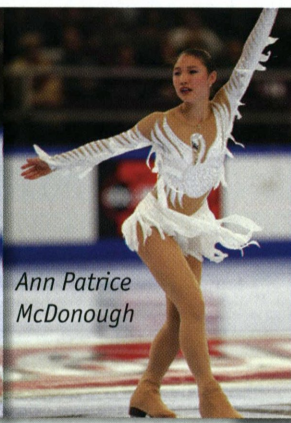

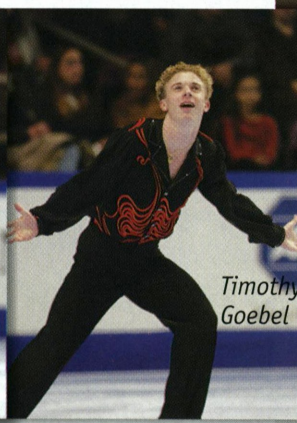

HISTORY made in Germany

Americans medal in every event as a new era in figure skating begins at Nebelhorn Trophy

The numbers on the scoreboard showing that American Jennifer Don won the ladies event at the Nebelhorn Trophy in Oberstdorf, Germany, in September were different than those Sarah Hughes received at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City. Instead of 5.8s and 5.9s that were posted for Hughes, Don saw:

Total Element score: 41.53

Program Component score: 52.00

SS: 10.72

TR: 9.68

PE: 10.64

CH: 10.16

IN: 10.80

Total Segment score: 93.53

Overall total: 143.07

With those scores, Don became the first ladies winner under the new ISU judging system.

taking action

In the upheaval following the pairs skating scandal at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games, the ISU searched for a new judging system that would be more fair to the skaters.

"I cannot hide our sad moment we had in Salt Lake City at the 2002 Olympic Games," said Ottavio Cinquanta, president of the ISU. "That case pushed the ISU into action."

The ISU acted and introduced its new system based on cumulative points and technology. The first official use of the cumulative points system was at the Nebelhorn Trophy, a traditional late summer event that is considered the season-opener for figure skating.

The event, usually a low-key affair, attracted some influential people in the sport such as Anton Piseyev, president of the Russian Figure Skating Federation, and Alexei Mishin, coach of current World champion Evgeny Plushenko. Mishin was taping everything in sight.

All wanted to learn about the new system that has already suffered growing pains.

"The events of February 2002 forced us to go faster, right or wrong, good or bad," said Ted Barton, the video technology consultant for the new system.

The results changed from the first day to the second day. The ISU admitted that "unfortunately the computer program made some incorrect decimal 'rounding' in the calculation of the judges' Grades of Execution (GOE)."

Cinquanta said the new system will be used at various international competitions this season.

"Our plan is to continue with the Grand Prix of Figure Skating — six events plus the final," Cinquanta said.

If the new scoring system is approved by the next ISU Congress in June 2004, it could be used for the European and World Championships in 2005 and the 2006 Winter Olympics in Torino, Italy.

how it works

Points in the system are accumulated based on the elements the skaters do on the ice. The judges have a chance to review elements with a video system, which gives the judges a chance to mark (up or down) things not at first visible to the naked eye.

"The video system contains proof of the performance of each skater," Cinquanta said.

This scrutiny showed in the ladies short program when Amber Corwin, the other American lady competing, was penalized on an attempted triple flip. Reviews reduced it to an overrotated double.

"From what I gather and watching others, clean programs are very important now," Don said. "They are cracking down on cheated jumps."

Corwin agreed with that assessment. "If there is more than a quarter turn

cheated, you get credit for a poorly done missed double," Corwin said.

Don benefited from a cleaner — although simpler — routine to win both the short program and the free skate.

Although Don did none of the harder jumps, the ones she did were done well. She scored better than the ladies who attempted more difficult routines but fell — such as Corwin, who finished seventh.

"I didn't have as many jumps as some of the girls did," said Don, 18. "It worked out in my favor since I did what I have."

Don's spins were marked higher than the average base value given on an ISU scale of values.

"The system favors the all-around skater," said Don's coach, Jeff DiGregorio. "It is not just a jumping competition."

In the past DiGregorio brought two better jumpers to Nebelhorn — Tara Lipinski and Sara Wheat. Both skaters failed to win or even medal.

In the short program, Don had the highest-scoring jump combination, a triple toe-double toe. But she gained bonus points on the Grades of Execution (GOE) from the judges while others had points deducted because of a cheated rotation or a two-foot landing.

Don got bonus points in the free skate for her jumps and spins while others underrotated or fell, as Corwin did twice. Those mistakes caused Corwin to fall from third to seventh overall.

The scoring system gave evidence to the fact that clean programs are rewarded. Don planned technical elements totaling 41.90 points – second lowest among the skaters. She received 41.53 points, the highest actual total received based on what they actually did.

Corwin planned elements totaling 52.90, second highest in the competition, but received only 26.95 points.

The artistic scores also went to Don, who received a combined score of 52.0 for Skating Skills (SS), Transitions (TR), Performance and Execution (PE), Choreography (CH) and Interpretation.

men's competition

In the men's event, Scott Smith ended up second after winning the free skate. Under the old system he would have won.

"Mentally we think we understand it, but we are not totally convinced it works yet," Smith said of the new judging system.

Under the cumulative results of the new system, Smith trailed Nicholas Young of Canada after the short program. Young did enough in the free skate to hold the overall lead over Smith, 183.13–181.40. Smith trailed by about nine points entering the free skate, but made up seven.

"He just had too much ground to make up," said Smith's coach, Mark Mitchell. "But that is one of the good things about the new system. A person can pull up."

Smith did the only quad in the competition, landing a Salchow in combination with a double toe in the short program.

Young's attempt at a quad toe in the free skate got him into trouble. He failed to get around on the rotation, and the jump was called a triple. Then he landed another triple toe in combination. When Young landed another triple toe – only his second planned triple toe – judges looked at it as his third because of the quad problem, and he received no points for last triple toe.

Mitchell said he was wary of such mistakes, thanks to attending a U.S. Figure Skating judging system seminar in Chicago in July.

"They explained what problems would cause a -1 or a -2 and what else would cause a minus, which helped," Mitchell said.

After Smith was marked down on spins and stepwork, Mitchell said he would take the score sheet and see what needs to be improved.

"There are things we are going to look at and get the levels up a bit higher and get the quality as good as we can get," Mitchell said.

U.S. competitor Nicholas LaRoche placed third in both the short program and the free skate to take the bronze medal. He outscored Young technically and outscored Smith in the performance portions.

ice dancing competition

In ice dancing, Americans led the way – at least symbolically. Americans Lydia Manon and Ryan O'Meara became the first to skate under the new system when they lead off the compulsory dance Thursday morning.

"We actually drew second and the Armenians pulled out," Manon said. "I was actually excited to go first instead of second, which is unusual in skating."

Manon and O'Meara also were involved in one of the vivid examples of the new system juggling placings, having a chance to win although they skated in the next-to-last group.

Six couples entered the final free dance with less than 3½ points separating them. Remember that this is ice dancing, a discipline notorious for its non-movement of places.

"That was very encouraging," said Manon, who had a chance to win although she and O'Meara entered the free dance in sixth. "The system is good because it allows for a lot of movement within the competition."

They ended up sixth in an odd way. They were fourth in the compulsory and fifth in both the original dance and free dance. But the cumulative totals kept them in sixth, barely eight points from the top and less than three points away from third.

They even outscored their teammates, Christie Moxley and Alexandr Kirsanov, in the free dance. Moxley and Kirsanov held on to win the bronze after entering the free dance in the second position.

Russians Svetlana Kulikova and Vitali Novikov won the event going from fifth after the compulsory to first overall.

pairs competition

In pairs, although Laura Handy and Jeremy Allen, and Larisa Spielberg and Craig Joeright came in third and fourth, respectively, both pairs struggled.

Handy fell twice and the errors were reflected in their technical scores.

"Everything is a learning experience," Handy said. "We have been skating good longs in practice. It was a bad day. Everyone has their bad days."

Spielberg and Joeright actually beat their teammates on the technical side, but Spielberg also fell on the opening sequence of jumps.

Canadians Utako Wakamatsu and Jean-Sebastian Fecteau won the pairs event.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Club leadership schools provide incredible benefits for those who attend

T*his really works!*" is the title of an afternoon session on fundraising at U.S. Figure Skating's Club Leadership and Business Management Schools. But that title applies to more than just the fundraising session. Most participants agree that the entire weekend of seminars and discussions is what really works.

learning and sharing

"I think it's extremely important for every club to attend one of these," said Diane Murphy, a participant in the October 2002 session in Cleveland, Ohio. "You get so much for your money; it's just unbelievable. Every club will come away with something."

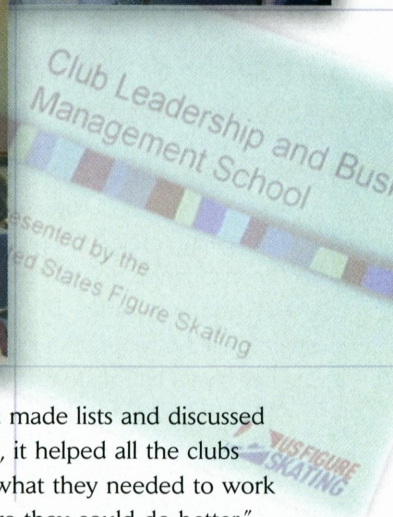
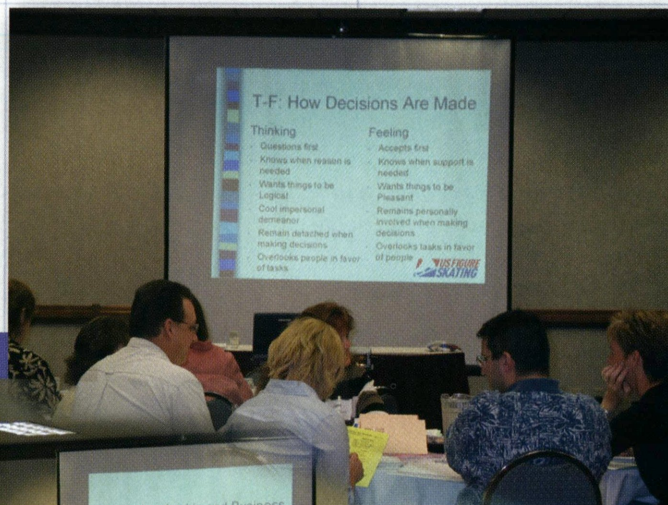
Murphy is administrator for the Cleveland Skating Office, an organization that includes 13 skating clubs in Cleveland.

Rose Snyder, senior director of membership development for U.S. Figure Skating, started the schools in September 2002 to provide an opportunity for skating club board members, coaches and rink personnel to learn and share new ideas for building strong leadership teams, crafting club missions, and learning more about governance, fiscal management, risk management, fundraising, volunteer recruitment and communication.

"I think the main benefit is the board retreat idea — being able to focus in on their own goals and tips for making themselves a better board," Snyder said.

Murphy said understanding how a club board should work is the biggest benefit that is gained during the school.

"You understand what goes into running a board, which is very helpful," she said. "It's not just for new clubs; old clubs got a lot out of it, too."



The day-and-a-half-long weekend is a required step for those establishing new clubs (within 12 months of becoming a club) and voluntary for others.

Greg Gibbs, publicity coordinator and a board member of the Broadmoor Skating Club, said when members of his board attended together, it helped motivate them and helped them realize that they were thinking the same things at the same time.

One exercise that helps build that cohesiveness in a board is the SWOT Analysis. SWOT stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. It is a tool that helps boards discover these areas in their clubs and build their goals and priorities around them.

"One of the big helps was the SWOT report," Murphy said. "When we all got

together and made lists and discussed those (areas), it helped all the clubs understand what they needed to work on and where they could do better."

connecting people

As of August 2003, more than 20 percent of U.S. Figure Skating's member clubs have been represented at the weekend schools with 350 individual participants. The 10 regional sessions planned for the 2003–2004 season are an expansion of the program over the five sectional sessions held in 2002–2003.

The opportunity to network with other clubs is a major benefit of the weekend retreats. Snyder said new clubs and long-standing clubs can learn from each other, and the club education schools are the perfect setting for that to happen.

Longtime U.S. Figure Skating member Ben Wright agrees.

"Interfacing with people of like mind and like interest is in itself a benefit," said Wright, now vice president of The Skating Club of Boston. "This seminar provided a means by which old clubs and new clubs could find common ground."

Murphy said the networking is great since newer board members and club leaders come away knowing people they can contact to discuss feelings, problems and ideas.

Many participants found it especially helpful to hear how other clubs handle volunteer recruitment and retention, fundraising and communication.

"We also got some good information on insurance and liability issues, taxation, rink/club coordination and relations — some things about personality styles that

would help us in a variety of situations," Gibbs said. "What we learned wasn't just conflict resolution but avoiding conflict."

Snyder said they bring the skeletons out of the closet and help people deal with the tough issues.

"[We spend] a significant amount of time on how to deal with the 2 percent of difficult people on boards," Synder said. "It's really important to put personal agendas aside and do the best thing for the clubs."

what to expect

The first activity of the weekend asks each participant to do a Myers Briggs analysis to understand his or her own motivations and behavior and to understand the behavior of others in order to improve communication.

"We talk about different personality

types — whether you're a big picture person vs. a detail person, how relationships and personalities come together, and how you can capitalize on different strengths to make a stronger team," Snyder said.

Communication is important and something that needs constant improvement. Gibbs said the Myers Briggs test helped focus on communication.

"We speak about communication a lot, but we never really break it down into key components," Gibbs said.

"Understanding learning styles goes a long way in improving communication."

Most of the sessions during the weekend are lead by Snyder. Part of Saturday morning is spent with the Myers Briggs Type Indicator. The second half of the morning utilizes strategic planning, including looking at the club's mission and performing the SWOT analysis. Saturday afternoon is spent discussing club administration (governance, board building, financial management, risk management and fundraising) and working with volunteers.

Sunday begins with an overview of U.S. Figure Skating (including membership, committees, programs and athlete funding), club programming

(including the importance of a strong Basic Skills program, which is the main feeder system for clubs; the Bridge Program; and events and competitions), and rink relations (including the STAR program, which is U.S. Figure Skating's partnership with USA Hockey). The Sunday sessions often include visits from guest speakers including Susi Wehrli, director of membership development for U.S. Figure Skating, who speaks on the Basic Skills and Bridge Programs, and Pat Kelleher or Dave Wescott from STAR.

Snyder varies the style of each session to keep participants motivated, utilizing small group exercises and open discussion. Wright and other participants feel that Snyder has a talent for helping people feel relaxed and comfortable.

"She kept the momentum going well," Gibbs said. "She was a lively instructor who encouraged participation. She got people doing things — got them up and about — not just sitting. Sometimes it was like a game and other times more contained."

Participants are given a resource notebook that contains additional information not covered during the weekend. Much of the information comes from BoardSource, the national center for nonprofit boards.

"They have been kind enough to provide a lot of great materials for our participant notebooks," Snyder said.

how it started

Snyder said U.S. Figure Skating started the Club Leadership and Business Management Schools for several reasons — as an outreach to stay connected to members, as a way to meet an education/orientation requirement for new clubs, and as a way to make all clubs, even long-standing ones, stronger.

"If new clubs are going to have a chance at success, they need to look at their club as a small business, not just a

parent-run 'club,'" Snyder said. "We feel that if our clubs are stronger, it will ultimately lead to an increase in membership. Clubs that have solid programs in place will retain more members.

"The other side benefit is that while we educate board members at the club level, this education and experience makes them more qualified some day when they serve as the volunteer leaders of U.S. Figure Skating."

While the school is mandatory for new clubs, the benefits of the program are reaped by any club that attends.

"It was just as much a value to an old charter club as to a new club," Wright said. "All the constituencies in a club need to be looked after and taken care of ... they're all working together to further the sport."

Snyder said the clubs that get the most out of the school are the ones that bring most, if not all, of their board members. She feels the most important thing participants take from the school is "a sense of appreciation for their role in their club."

"It's really interesting and sometimes a little frightening for people to realize the responsibility," Snyder said. "After attending a school they have a better understanding of their job."

Gibbs said the benefits gained from the school outweigh the investment.

"It's tough to set aside a weekend for anything, let alone a volunteer association," he said. "There were things you could take home with you to work that could be applied outside just skating or club responsibilities."

Murphy said the school she attended was extremely successful and encourages others to attend.

"You don't want to miss this; it's really worth attending," Murphy said.

10 Club Leadership Schools planned for 2003-2004

For 2003-2004, there will be 10 Club Leadership and Business Management Schools, one for each region. Regional schools allow participants to commute to the sessions each day, making the weekend affordable at \$75 per person.

Host cities and dates for upcoming sessions include Orlando, Nov. 15-16; Los Angeles, Feb. 21-22; Chicago, March 13-14; and San Diego, May 3-4 (in conjunction with Governing Council). Prior sessions were held in Dallas, Philadelphia, Minneapolis, Buffalo and Detroit.

In addition to reaching more participants, the program's goals for 2003-2004 include adding two new breakout sessions to the agenda: a parents' education track and a testing track.

Rose Snyder, senior director for membership development, said the parent session will focus on how to be a supportive parent, will include some information on the sport, but is "mostly an opportunity for the parents to share and ask questions."

She said the test sessions will be a think tank as well as an opportunity to see and try out the new online testing program.

ON THE ICE

On the air, on the ice

For one adult skater ice dancing provides freedom from the ever-stressful world of television news

Each weeknight, Susie Gharib delivers the news on the longest-running and highest-rated business program on television – the Nightly Business Report.

A familiar face to millions of viewers, Gharib is known for her in-depth knowledge of business stories and market trends. Incisive yet personal, she regularly interviews movers and shakers from Wall Street, Washington, D.C., and around the world. But what many people don't know is that when Gharib is off the air, she is on the ice. She tempers her high-profile, high-pressure career with the freedom she finds as an ice dancer.

getting away from it all

"Skating has a very special place in my heart," said Gharib, a pre-gold ice dancer who trains four mornings a week at the Sky Rink at Chelsea Piers in New York City. "I feel energized when I go skating. You're gliding across the ice so fast, the cool wind is in your face."

Her work life in television is stressful and tense. Gharib is often running against the clock hearing that she has only five minutes until she's on the air and then being given only two or three minutes to conduct an interview.

"Skating is the opposite of that," Gharib said. "There's a certain freedom – that 50 minutes on the ice is sheer pleasure."

Balance, peace and tranquility are other perks Gharib receives from skating.

"Skating clears my head, allows me to think better, perform better," said the 52-year-old who has been at NBR since 1998. "It allows me to do my best work."

But eventually that 50 minutes is up and it is back to the real world. At the end of her early morning skating sessions, Gharib's thoughts shift to debt market treasuries and NASDAQ indices instead of tangos and waltzes, as she makes the transition from ice dancer to television personality.

"When I take my skates off, change out of my leotard and put on my business suit and makeup, everybody says it looks like I'm going to a boardroom," Gharib said.

Many of the people at the rink know what Gharib does for a living. Sometimes she gets feedback about the show, suggestions for an interview or questions about stocks and bonds.

While at the rink, however, the focus is usually on figure skating.

"I love being around the skaters," Gharib said. "Conversations are different than when talking with Wall Street strategists or economists. We talk about good music for a program or choreography. I might say to Oksana Baiul, 'Isn't that a beautiful piece of music?' Or I'll watch Sasha Cohen's program before Worlds and wish her good luck. Later in the day, I'm interviewing the president of Mobile or Exxon. It's in stark contrast to my mainstream conversations throughout the day."

hard work, high standards

Although ice dancing provides a perfect counter to Gharib's hectic career, there are also some similarities. Like her approach to work, she views skating as serious business.

"My skating is more than a hobby. That's too light a word," Gharib said. "I get up early in the morning and compromise my sleep to squeeze in skating before I go to work. Some days the demands of work get in the way, but I try to be consistent because practice makes perfect."

Gharib said Gezalian has high standards for her skating, but that it isn't a problem since she has high standards set for herself as well.

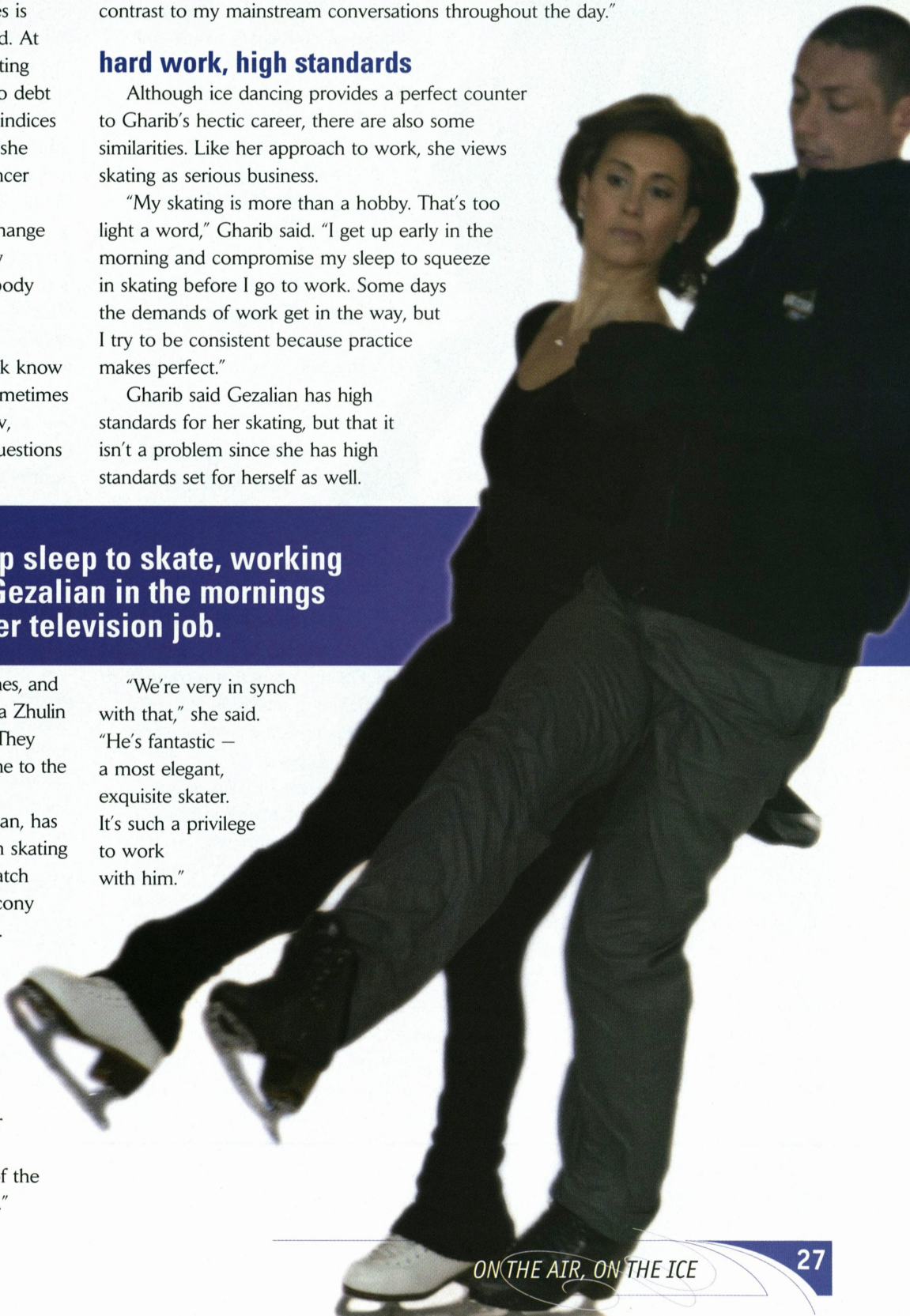
"The parents and skaters, coaches, and Judy Blumberg, Moira North, Sasha Zhulin all watch the program," she said. "They were watching it before I ever came to the rink. We have a wide audience."

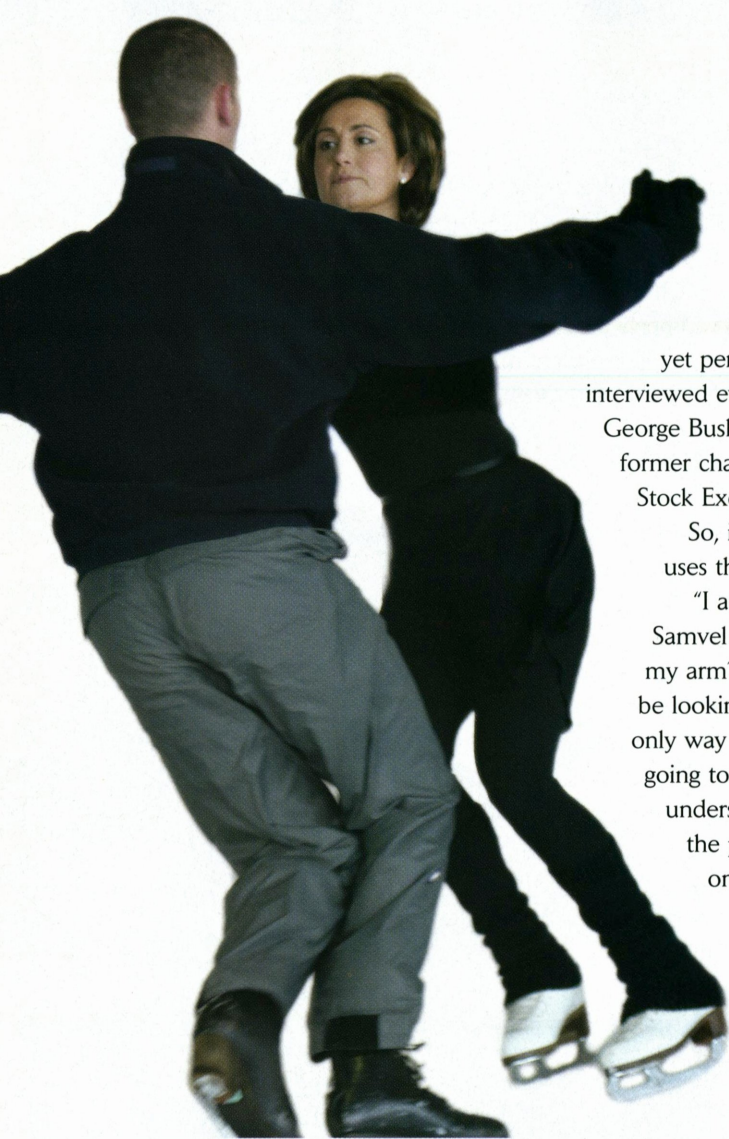
Gharib's coach, Samvel Gezalian, has even brought some of his Russian skating friends to the control room to watch NBR broadcast live from the balcony of the New York Stock Exchange.

"It's great. It's the center of the financial world," Gezalian said. "When she's part of this world, I look at her differently. When she comes to the rink, on ice as my student it's one thing, but working on her job, interviewing these high-level people — she's good! She's one of the great people I've met in America."

"We're very in synch with that," she said.

"He's fantastic — a most elegant, exquisite skater. It's such a privilege to work with him."





A self-described “goal-oriented person” Gharib’s focus on skating has brought her to the difficult pre-gold dances. She’s passed the blues and plans to tackle the Kilian this winter before retesting the paso doble, which she said she has failed “a couple of times.”

While Gharib said that passing the golds would be very meaningful to her, she feels accomplishing that goal might take a little bit longer now that the Starlight Waltz has been moved to the pre-gold level. But her focus and desire to constantly improve her skating will help her accomplish that goal.

“When I tell her something to do, she always does exactly what I ask her — that’s good,” Gezalian said. “She’s always going for 100 percent. She is focused, elegant, fast and really professional.”

She also won’t let anything slide — with her professional training she is

inclined to ask even the seemingly minor questions. In the world of journalism, Gharib is known for her incisive, yet personal approach, and has interviewed everyone from President George Bush to Richard Grasso, the former chairman of the New York Stock Exchange.

So, it’s not surprising that she uses the same method on ice.

“I ask so many questions of Samvel: ‘Where do I put my hip, my arm? Where am I supposed to be looking?’” she said. “That’s the only way I can grasp what I’m going to do. Then, when I understand and can put all the pieces together, I work on the presentation.”

challenges on ice and off

Facing new challenges is an inevitable part of growth — whether you’re

climbing the ladder of success or rising through the ice dance tests.

While Gharib recalls that moving from print journalism to television was a hard transition, she faced the challenge and has become successful.

“It took a couple of years to feel comfortable and be myself in front of the camera,” said Gharib, who once wrote for *Fortune Magazine*. “There’s a different kind of language, more conversation, concern about how you look on the air, a lot to learn and a lot of people to collaborate with. In print, it was myself, my notebook and my questions — it was much simpler.”

Likewise, perfecting the complicated pre-gold dances is hard, Gharib said. At times skating can be frustrating — especially, Gharib said, when she starts concentrating hard on what she thinks the judges will want.

“Sometimes it gets frustrating and you hit a wall,” she said. “At times I think I’m not going to do this; am I wasting my time? One time, I was in tears; I said ‘I’m never going to pass.’”

That’s when some good advice from Judy Blumberg, one of the well-known coaches at Chelsea Piers, helped Gharib “get out of the rules and regulations and into the spirit.”

“Judy said that when people are watching you, it should look like you’re having fun,” Gharib said. “She took me on the ice, and we did simple things like stroking and turning. She didn’t care if I did it right or wrong; we were smiling and laughing. Judy told me to enjoy it, after all, this is a dance! And when you do a beautiful performance, it will be well regarded.”

It may seem strange that someone who talks to millions of television viewers each night could be stressed or nervous in front of a panel of skating judges. But that is exactly what Gharib, who has a master’s degree in internal affairs from Columbia University, has experienced.

“It’s kind of interesting,” said Gharib, a 20-year veteran of television journalism who has also worked for CNN, CNBC and a New York City ABC affiliate. “On my first skating test, there were only dozens watching, but I was a lot more nervous than when I’m on TV. I was so prepared. I wasn’t even thinking about it. Then I was on the ice, my hands shaking, my knees knocking. But I passed!”

preparing for performance

Gharib knows it takes a lot of work to be successful, on or off the ice, no matter how effortless or easy it appears.

“When people watch me interviewing, it looks seamless,” Gharib said. “But, I am working and preparing all the time. Behind the scenes there are the camera people, the producers and all the people who help me. [There is a] tremendous amount of research and preparation work that goes into a television interview.”

Skating is no different. When Gharib skates a beautiful dance it may look seamless, but a tremendous amount of work and preparation have gone into that performance.

"The three-minute interview, that two-minute dance – you blink and it's over," she said. "But, every turn, every piece of footwork has been worked over and practiced and practiced. It takes hours and hours, months and months, sometimes years, to accomplish a level of mastery, whether it's the paso doble, or an interview with a CEO."

Knowing the hard work that goes into a performance, Gharib applauds every adult skater who either tests or competes. And although she doesn't compete, Gharib is pleased that there are so many opportunities open to adult skaters today.

"Any adult skater who goes out for a test or a competition should get a medal for going out there," Gharib said. "It takes a tremendous amount of confidence and self-esteem in the face of the pressure and the perceptions about adult skaters. You may not be an Olympian, but when you love skating this much, I think it's still worth it to go out there and live your fantasy. I'd give them all a gold medal."

an unexpected start

It is amazing that Gharib's passion for skating all started with a birthday party. While she had taken recreational lessons when she was 9 or 10 and skated a

handful of times in high school and college, she didn't begin pursuing skating as a serious hobby until she had children of her own.

"Back then I didn't really know any of the fancy footwork," she said. "I just skated around and around the rink in a circle – the 'washing machine' style of skating."

Then when her son, Alexi Nazem, was 5 he attended an ice skating birthday party, and Gharib took to the ice again. Her son enjoyed it so much that she bought both of her children skates for Christmas and a pair for herself so that she could be with them as a safety measure.

"As soon as I went out on the ice with my \$40 skates, I remembered the feeling – this is great," Gharib said.

Her son, now a 21-year-old senior at Yale, hung up his skates in the fifth grade, but Gharib continued with private lessons. At the urging of her first coach, David Hold, she began testing her skills, starting where all ice dancers begin – the Dutch Waltz, with its relatively simple, forward skating steps.

But Gharib is not the only one in the family to keep lacing up the skates. Her 18-year-old daughter, Taraneh Nazem, has also continued skating and passed the Killian this summer.

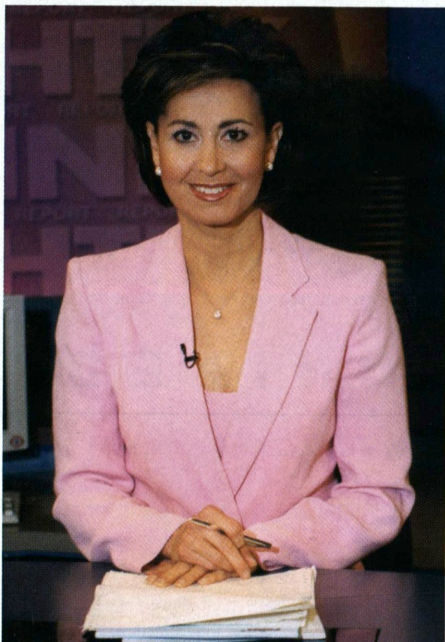
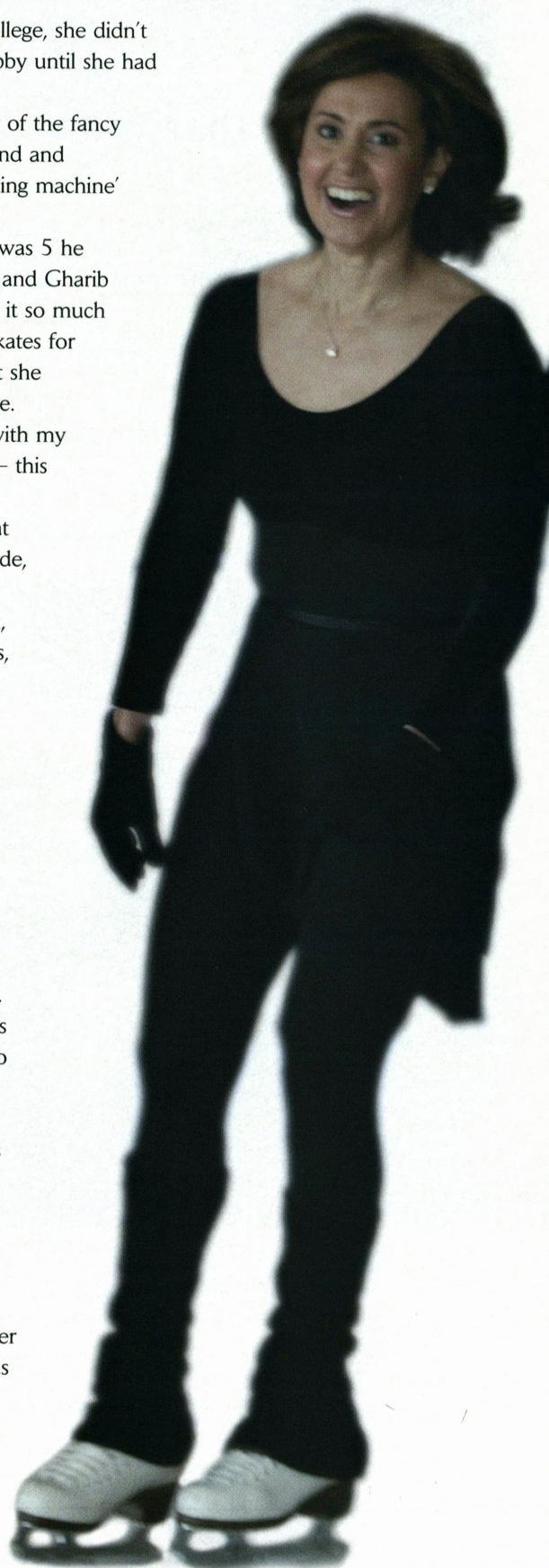
Gharib's family is important to her and that is obvious to others in her life.

"I've never seen someone who loves her family, her husband, her children so much," Gezalian said.

That love and respect in the family is mutual. Taraneh, a freshman at Yale, is proud of her mother and her commitment to succeed.

"She's one of the most determined people I've ever come across," Taraneh said. "Very few people can pick up ice dancing at such a late age and master it. I envy the fact that she always spends a lot of time on warm-up, crossovers, the nitty-gritty details. My mom is a role model on and off the ice."

GRIEVANCE REPORT

Jacqueline Mero

In March 2003, the U.S. Figure Skating Association initiated a disciplinary proceeding against Jacqueline Mero under USFSA Bylaw Article XXVII, Sec 3 (b), alleging the following violations: GR 1.02 (USFSA Code of Ethics) and GR 1.04 (Harassment and Abuse Policy). Ms. Mero was notified of the grievance and through her counsel, responded to these allegations and submitted documentation to the

Grievance Committee Chair. In accordance with USFSA Bylaws, a hearing panel was appointed and a hearing was held on July 28, 2003. The Hearing Panel made extensive factual findings and concluded that Ms. Mero violated both GR 1.02 and GR 1.04. The Hearing Panel ruled that Ms. Mero's membership should be revoked and that she should be banned from membership in the USFSA for life. Ms. Mero was also assessed costs in the amount of \$3,500. No appeal was filed. Therefore, the Hearing Panel's decision is now final.

ASK MR. EDGE



It's that time again! Soon the gobble will be gracing tables everywhere throughout America, the snow will begin to fall, and the holidays will bring us good cheer. This year we celebrate the third anniversary of Ask Mr. Edge.

I'd like to take a few lines and thank everyone for making Ask Mr. Edge a successful addition to SKATING magazine. I can tell from the e-mails I'm receiving that skaters throughout the world share many of the same problems. It humbles me to think that I've been able to offer some Edge relief (pun intended) to skaters from around the country and the world, too.

As a reminder to all, please be sure to include your return e-mail address so that I'm able to directly respond to your questions. Once in a while I receive a question and

there is either no return e-mail address or it is incorrectly typed. Always be sure to check your return e-mail address. Thank you all very much!

With winter on the way, I wanted to remind you not to leave your skates in the trunk of your car for long periods of time. The last thing you want to do is put a pair of ice-cold skates on your feet. This would not be good for your circulation, especially if your feet are already cold. You might also find it difficult to get a good feel for the ice when skating.

Having said that, let's move on to the most important section: your questions!

'CAUSE HE KNOWS

Q: I was looking at some web sites that sell blades and have a question about some of the terms used in describing the qualities of certain blades. It says that the Phantom Special is a "dove tail" blade type. What does this mean exactly?

Also, could you define the following: "parallel and tapered"? I want to be sure that I understand these terms correctly as well.

GREENVILLE, S.C.

Q: I recently bought new blades and they are impossible to dry. After I skate, the condensation stays on them for a long time. No matter how long I dry them off, either with my wipe rag or tissues, they stay wet. They dry an hour later after I'm home and have taken them out of my bag, removed the soft guards, and once again wiped them down. Is there anything I can use or do differently to prevent my blades from staying wet and rusting?

ACTON, MASS.

A: In reverse order to your question — a parallel-sided blade is nothing more than a blade that is flat on both sides. This means that when the blank for the blade (before the toe picks are cut into it) is cut, it remains smooth on both sides of the blade.

A tapered blade starts out the same way, but during the production process it is run through a series of grinding steps to create the tapering in the blade (the width of the blade being thickest at the front and thinnest at the rear).

The disadvantage to a tapered blade is that it's generally more difficult to sharpen. Some skate clamps are not able to hold it properly in place while sharpening, thus making it harder to achieve level edges along the entire length of the blade.

Now for the dovetail design! When you look at the Phantom Special from the back, you'll notice that the shape of the blade has been tapered and actually looks like a dove's tail, or dovetail. (Check out the new MK web site at www.riedellskates.com.) The advantage is that there is improved edge bite throughout the entire length of the blade.

A: Unfortunately, during the hot and humid summer months there's not much else to do except make sure you use a terry cloth towel when wiping down your blades. Upon returning home, remove your soft guards until your blades have completely dried. Before putting the soft guards on again, you may want to wipe down your blades with an oilcloth. This will help to prevent rusting.

Well readers, I can't believe I've used up all my space already. Sometimes however, your questions do require longer answers. In next month's issue, I'll try to answer more of your questions.

North American CHALLENGE SKATE

Events give
young skaters
a taste of
international
competition

As always the North American Challenge Skate events provided valuable competition experience for young U.S., Canadian and Mexican skaters. But a history-making blackout in the Northeast gave participants in one 2003 NACS event more than they bargained for.

Thornhill, Aug. 14–17 Heather Nemier, team leader

This competition was also known as the “night the lights went out in Toronto.” The NACS in Thornhill, Ontario, a suburb of Toronto, started on a normal, even, mundane note with an uneventful, but upbeat team meeting attended by all 23 athletes and their coaches. For the draw the skaters picked supersized Hershey’s kisses

with the skating order number on them. But it was at the end of the draw that the fun in Ontario really began — the power went out. Almost immediately, the hotel generators kicked in and everyone could see their way out of the meeting room. Some of the skaters had gone to their rooms to get changed for their first practice, which was supposed to begin shortly after the draw ended.

Instead the team gathered in the hotel lobby to see how long the power might be out. With wild rumors flying around, U.S. Team Director Denise Thomas and I tried to find out what happened and how soon things would be back to normal. We finally determined that the outage affected much more than just the Toronto area — it seemed likely that the the whole Northeast was affected.

Denise and I met with Michelle Kho, the tech rep, and Susan Blatz, the chief referee, to determine what would be done. The arena didn't have power either, so we kept everyone at the hotel until more information was available.

The afternoon and evening passed with the team hanging out in the lobby, playing games, getting to know each other, eating at the restaurant — which fortunately used natural gas — and asking a lot of questions. It became obvious that there would be no practices that evening, but Friday's schedule was left intact until further notice.

The hotel management was not sure the hotel would have enough generator power to last through the night, so all hotel guests were asked to gather in the lobby. We were told to bring pillows since we might be sleeping in the lobby.

Some skaters were thrilled with this slumber party idea, while others weren't so enthralled with the idea! Eventually, it was determined that the hotel had enough generator power to last until dawn, so we returned to our rooms. Guests without flashlights were escorted to their rooms.

Interestingly enough flashlights are one of the items on the recommended packing list provided by U.S. Figure Skating Headquarters. That fact generated a lot of conversation, mostly between those who had brought them and those who hadn't! I bet every team member who was in Thornhill will pack a flashlight in the future.

Around 5 a.m. the power came back on and with it came a new set of problems. That morning we met with the tech rep, referee and the Canadian team leaders about the Friday schedule. The rink had power again and had managed to keep the ice through the night, though it was a little soft. Morning practices were cancelled in order to get the ice back to competition form.

We had major concerns about whether the power would stay on and

allow us to get in all the first rounds in on Friday. So, the schedule was redone so each event would have a practice, immediately followed by the first round (short program for singles and compulsory dance for the dancers).

It was a bit unorthodox, but the skaters were terrific about going with the flow. All were excited to finally get on the ice, although many showed the effects of the ups and downs of the past 24 hours.

The first two events — junior compulsory dance and novice ladies — went off without a hitch. The novice ice dancers took the ice next. The first seven teams skated without incident. But just as the final team of Michelle Scott and Alex Clark from the United States took the ice, the power went out again. The audience groaned, and after a couple of minutes the arena staff locked the dressing rooms and evacuated the arena.

The judges were secluded from the skaters, coaches and audience. After an hour delay in the August sun, the power came back on. Scott and Clark were given a new warm-up and finally skated their dance. The audience cheered at their sportsmanship.

At end of the day, the U.S. skaters were in medal contention in all events. Junior ice dancers were in second, third, seventh and eighth places; novice ladies were in second, fourth, fifth and seventh; novice ice dancers were in second, fourth and two teams tied for seventh; and novice men were in first, second and sixth.

The team was happy to have the long day over with, but the problems did create a great sense of team unity. Everyone returned to the hotel looking forward to Saturday's final rounds and a good night's rest.

But that was not to be. At 1:30 a.m., the fire alarm in the hotel sounded and everyone was asked to evacuate the building. So, in pajamas we trudged down three or four flights of stairs to gather outside and regroup.

When we learned the alarm was power related, an interesting camaraderie developed. The team compared notes as to what everyone had grabbed before they left their rooms. A surprising number of

skaters had brought their skates and costumes with them, a few remembered their passports, but some brought nothing – not even their room keys!

I'll never forget the sight of Blake Rosenthal sitting on the curb in her pajamas with her curlers bobbing as she chatted away at 2 a.m. One parent had her camera in her purse and snapped a team photo in front of one of the fire trucks. Finally, we were allowed back in our rooms after the firefighters determined the alarm went off because of the power surges occurring in the still delicate power supply.

Saturday morning came too early, but everyone made it to the rink on time. First on the ice were the ladies, and the effects of the disruptions and too little sleep showed in most of the performances.

At the end of the competition U.S. skaters left with five medals, including one gold, two silver and two bronze. One junior ice dancing team, Samantha Cepican and Phillip Lichtor had to withdraw from the competition after Cepican aggravated an injury she had sustained the previous day.

Once the events were over, everyone returned to the hotel for the traditional pizza party. Unfortunately there was a problem and the pizza was delayed in

arriving. One of the Canadian team leaders and I ran out and brought back chips and soda to hold everyone over until the pizza arrived.

Being hungry wasn't a problem, however, since the teams were having a great time getting to know each other and going over the eventful three days in Thornhill. Some of the Canadian skaters were teaching the U.S. skaters phrases in French, and they spent a lot of time comparing school and culture. All in all, it was great to see the interactions among a great group of young people.

Believe it or not, being a team leader at this event was a terrific experience for me. There were a lot of problems, but the camaraderie and friendships that were made during this NACS will be what I remember from this trip.

There is a saying that adversity makes you stronger, and in the case of the 23 young skaters I had the privilege of working with in Thornhill, that was certainly true.

They – and all of U.S. Figure Skating – should be proud of how they conducted themselves while representing our country.

Lake Placid, July 10–13 Brittney Bottoms, team leader

The NACS in Lake Placid, New York, was a great experience for the skaters. We all stayed at the Olympic Training Center with athletes from sports such as volleyball, handball, luge, skeleton, biathlon and ski jumping to name a few. This atmosphere was great for our athletes because they were able to see how other athletes live and train.

All events were held in conjunction with the Lake Placid summer competition, so there was always family, friends and other skaters there to cheer for our team. The atmosphere of the competition was friendly and relaxed. Many of our skaters became friends with other U.S. Team members, and also with the Canadian and Mexican skaters.

All of the U.S. skaters came to the event prepared to compete and represent their country in the best way they knew how and it paid off; our team won a medal in every event.

I want to thank those who chose me to be a team leader. I also want to thank the skaters for being such great representatives for our country. The skaters on this team were sweet and well-behaved. I think they are, and will continue to be, great ambassadors for the sport and our country in future events.

The Life of a Synchro Team

Each day brings new challenges and rewards for Team Elan

A day in the life of a top synchronized skating team is anything but typical. While these teams certainly follow a set training regimen, each day is different. SKATING magazine caught up with Team Elan, based out of the Detroit Skating Club in Bloomfield Hills, Mich., to discover what happens on a day-to-day basis as an elite synchronized skating team trains for the competitive season.

preparing for the season

Team Elan Senior is the current synchronized skating U.S. bronze medalist and earned second and fourth-place finishes on the world stage during the 2002–2003 season (at the Spring Cup and the North American International Synchronized Skating Competition respectively).

Elan is a French word that means “enthusiasm, vigor, liveliness, speed, flair, and style” — a fitting name for a team that incorporates elements of each. So, how does a team train for enthusiasm, vigor, liveliness, speed, flair and style?

Team Elan is more than the 20 skaters competing on the ice. The team is made up of 24 skaters (20 competitors plus four support skaters), head coach Jeannine Cullen, trainer Debbie Pitsos, dance consultant Brandon Forsyth, technical specialist Ann Seror Barr, and Anne Schelter, creator of Annie’s Edges.

Team Elan also has a junior team, an intermediate team, a juvenile team, a preliminary team and an adult team.

Team Elan Senior begins its training season at the end of June with a week-long “boot camp” during which the team lives, works and plays together.

A typical day during boot camp begins with ballet or fitness training and five hours of ice time. Here the team begins work on its short program, particularly the footwork and edging.

Whether the team has lots of returning members or many new ones, the team dynamic changes every year.

“If you change only one skater, it changes the entire chemistry of the team,” Cullen said.

After boot camp, Team Elan goes on hiatus during July. On Aug. 1, Team Elan begins its weekly training regimen and starts fine-tuning the short program. Work on the free skate begins at the end of August.

a typical week

The typical training week begins on Sunday at noon with an hour of ballet. Then comes an hour of off-ice work, including head movements, footwork review, and discussion of interpretation of the music and expression. They also use this time to do unison drills.

The next three hours are spent on the ice repeating skills to music as well as drilling step sequences and turns. The remaining practice time is spent working on the short program and the free skate.

“My favorite part of training is when we first start to learn the programs in the beginning; it’s exciting to learn something new and get to see who you’re skating next to,” said Katherine Graney, assistant captain for Team Elan Senior.

Additional on-ice training sessions are held on Monday and Thursday evenings. These three-hour sessions include work with Barr on edge practice. The team may also spend time “creating new choreography, refining the programs and training the energy systems; the emphasis changes as the season progresses,” Barr said.

The end of Monday’s practice is spent in aerobic training, including 15 minutes spent in constant movement (drilling inside and outside edges, forward and backward crossovers, Choctaws, etc.). On Thursdays the team works with Forsyth, a competitive ice dancer with partner Emilie Nussear

(2000 World Junior silver medalists), on stroking and dance moves. He gives the team exercises focusing on edge quality, musicality and choreography.

"As the sets become less difficult, I add more steps so that many pieces of footwork can be inserted directly into the program," Forsyth said. "The extra focus on the individual sequences makes the girls all stronger skaters and improves the team as a whole."

Anaerobic/interval training fills the end of Thursday practices. On both Monday and Thursday work is done on the short program and free skate.

Practices can be hard, but Team Elan Senior's captain, Michelle Manery, enjoys the hard work.

"My favorite part of training is the feeling of accomplishment after a long practice," Manery said. "But my least favorite part is when we're learning the programs because I am so anxious to run through them smoothly and see the finished product."

In addition to the practice sessions, skaters complete additional weekly training requirements. They must participate in the fitness program at the Detroit SC, which includes core body strength, weights and off-ice aerobics. They can use the gym at the rink, do some activities at home, or fit the requirements into their fitness program.

staying motivated

Team Elan spends much of December through April on the road competing, taking part in the U.S. Synchronized Team Skating Championships and various international competitions.

Of course, training and practice schedules are different when Team Elan is on the road. They practice once or twice a day but make time to see the sites as well.

"We are a hard-working team," Graney said. "We love each other like a family and are determined to win!"

With such a busy schedule, it might seem tough to keep a large group of skaters motivated. But the hard work motivates members of Team Elan to work harder. They know it will take hard work to accomplish the goals they've set. Graney said the team's goals include everything from making memories to winning the U.S. title and placing in the top eight at Worlds.

"The team as a whole stays motivated by making progress," Cullen said. "As a coach, I keep them motivated by being quick to point out what I thought was great, and follow it with something that might need more work. I always try to present the positive first."

Cullen is famous for her line "There's good news and there's bad news ..." and team members agree that seeing positive progress is extremely motivating.

"I am mainly motivated by my teammates and coaches because I see how hard they work, which makes me want to work harder so I don't let them down," Manery said.

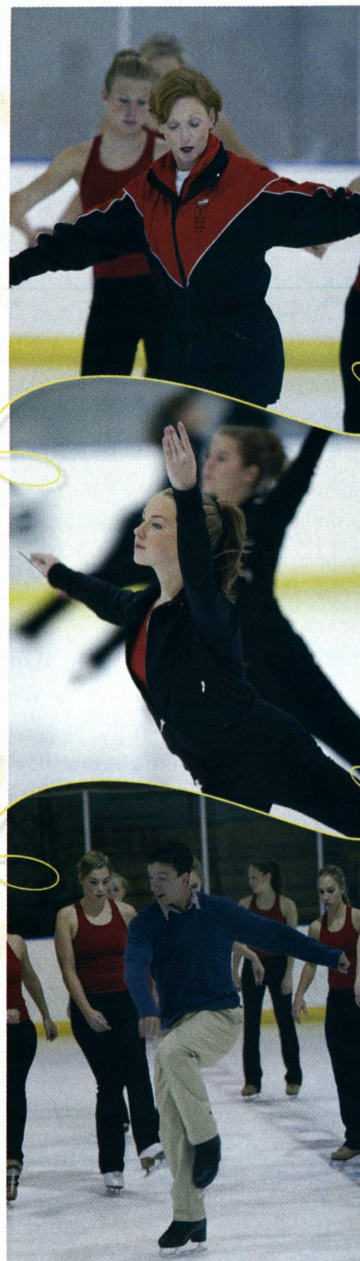
Cullen stays motivated by seeing her vision come to life.

"The best part is watching what you imagined come to life when they perform," Cullen said. "Without them I could pick up a hundred ideas and never see them displayed. I feel fortunate to get up and go work with these kids."

a special bond

So, what sets Team Elan apart? Cullen said one of the nice things about the team is that it's members compete with people they know, since many have grown up competing with Team Elan at various levels.

"Most of these kids have trained as a team for years. That's what makes our programs unique," Cullen said. "They have a style that is recognizable.

They have a signature. If someone didn't announce the name, it would be clear that it was Team Elan skating."

Forsyth said everyone involved is special, and each person contributes to making the team what it is.

"We have a great group of ladies who are individually talented and as a group

are amazing and beautiful to watch," he said. "All are gold-level skaters and had to go through a difficult tryout process. Also, the head coach is a master at working with this team. I am amazed at how she can take 25 different skaters and visualize then execute the intricate changes in position and footwork that make up the competitive programs."

Barr said while every synchronized team is special, Team Elan sets itself apart with unique programs that maintain a thread of consistency from season to season.

"The thread that runs through Team Elan's history is the feminine look they achieve through movement, costumes and themes," she said. "Last year's fairy program was the epitome of Team Elan's grace and femininity."

team elan junior

The tradition of success for Team Elan filters down to its junior team, the "little sister to the senior team," according to coach Brooke Sloan. The junior team has also found success on both the national and international level.

While the junior team does not train with the senior team, their training regimens are similar. Formal practices are held Sunday, Wednesday and Thursday. And Sundays are spent in an off-ice session, working on programs on the floor, before getting onto the ice for additional practice.

"The team has a strong work ethic," Sloan said. "They never lose sight of their team goals throughout a season, and by accomplishing their short-term goals, the long-term goal becomes the tool for their motivation."

Last season Team Elan Junior won the Spring Cup and placed second at the U.S. Synchronized Team Skating Championships. Sloan said staying motivated on the road can be difficult, but traveling as a team helps the skaters bond.



The hard work of being part of a synchronized team pays off, not just when the team wins but with the close relationships that are formed by the members of the team.

"Being an international team is an honor and is the result of their hard work, that becomes the motivation," Sloan said.

Team Elan is like a big family. Sloan enjoys watching the skaters grow as individuals and team members, and seeing them move to the senior team.

"All of us are watching our discipline grow and evolve each year. That's special to watch and be a part of," she said. ■

What makes the United Skates special? The intermediate team is special because we have come from all over Southern California to create this team. We continue to draw skaters from different clubs and different ethnic groups, languages and religious backgrounds. We truly fit our name the United Skates — we UNITE together as a team.

Team goals: Our goal for the 2002–2003 season was to qualify for the U.S. Synchronized Team Skating Championships by placing at Pacific Coast Sectionals. We tied for second and were awarded third after a tie-breaker. We felt wonderful because this was our first year to skate as the intermediate team. Competing at the championships was a dream come true.

What is the best part of being on a synchronized team? For this year's team one of the best parts has been getting to know one another better while writing a team essay for the SKATING magazine essay contest.

What are some of your favorite memories? At the championships while watching our junior team skate, we held up letters to spell out United Skates. Later we learned that we had been holding up the letters so they spelled "Untied" Skates. We're good spellers; we just had too much excitement.

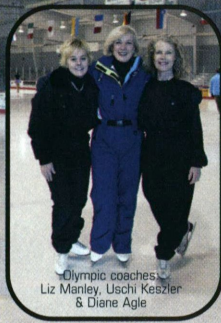

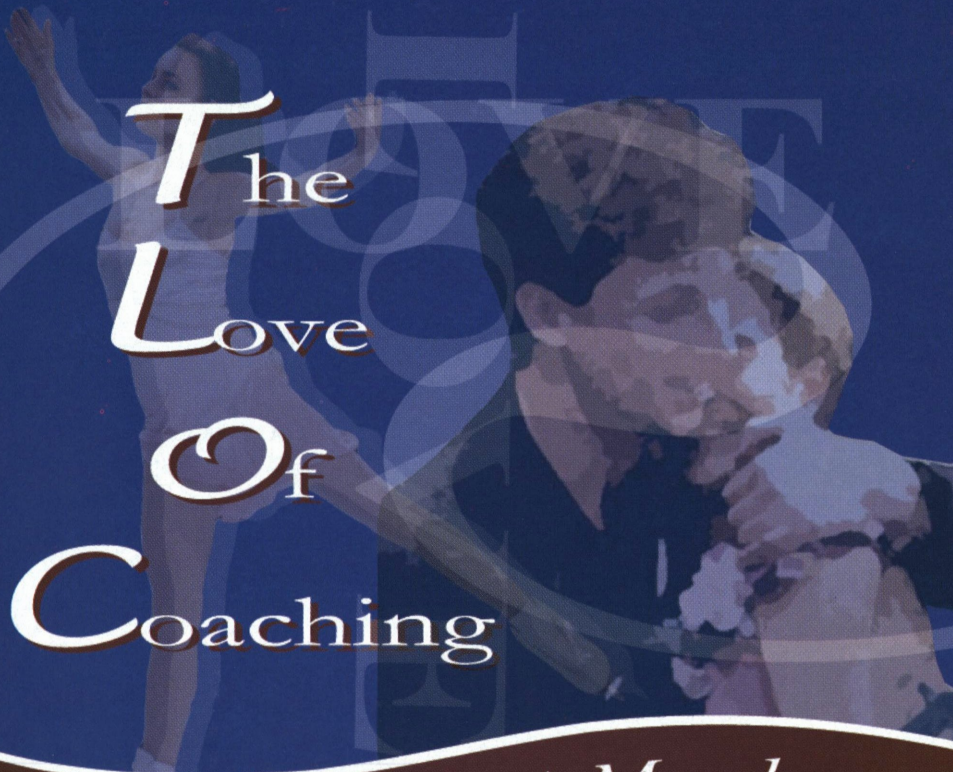

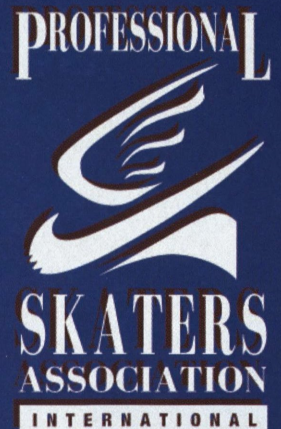

State Games of America "Strike Gold Here"

Under a brightly lit August sky at Rentschler Field in Hartford, Conn., the State Games of America opened for the third time. The view from the stadium was impressive with four skydivers diving to the field, where more than 4,000 athletes and coaches plus 6,000 spectators gathered to celebrate the opening ceremonies at the brand new arena. One diver carried the American Flag, while the others represented the gold, silver and bronze medals.

This Olympic-style qualifying event featured athletes from 43 states competing in 13 different sports. The athletes marched into the arena wearing shirts representing the four State Games regions while the Olympic-theme music blasted over the sound system.

four-day competition

The figure skating events were held at the International Skating Center of Connecticut in Simsbury, Conn., and the Veterans Memorial Ice Rink in the Hartford area. About 1,000 skaters competed with almost 2,000 starts during this four-day competition. Events were offered in compulsories, short program, freeskate (restricted and unrestricted), dance, footwork and spotlight from the Basic Skills levels to the senior levels.

Skaters had to qualify for the State Games of America by placing in the top three at their state's Games during the previous two years. Since not all State Games offer the same events, some skaters had to slide into corresponding events with respect to either their current test level or the level in which they qualified for the Games.

"I know that my judges worked hard and did an outstanding job,"

said Don Mumper, current State Games Committee Chair and referee of the event. "I am pleased with how everyone worked together to make the SGA a success."

a tradition of success

Judy Edmunds, former chair of the State Games Committee, said the committee has been successful since its inception. She believes there are several reasons for that success including:

- *The Bay State Games set a solid foundation of figure skating in the United States for State Games;*
- *The intent was to promote the numbers of athletes within a sport in a state;*
- *The founders were athletes, which taught them all the strength of life and the ability to get along in most situations.*

"The State Games Committee from the beginning had prestige," she said. "It always held the position for the common good of the athlete."

Edmunds said the State Games movement gave her the ability to grow in a sport as well as meet people in other sports and understand the structures of those sports.

"I want to thank all those who have worked with me over the years for having the insight to see the importance of these State competitions," Edmunds said. "Without these pioneers, the State Games of America would not have taken place. It was working with Bob Crowley, Bill Fitzpatrick, Don Mumper, Jenise Jensen and Carolyn Hudnall that enabled the figure skating portion of State Games to participate in the bi-annual State Games of America."



part of something bigger

From the outside looking in, the true strength in the State Games of America is the pride the athletes feel being part of a bigger event. There are many invitational competitions

for U.S. Figure Skating competitors sanctioned every weekend. But the State Games sets itself apart because it offers all grass-roots sports including gymnastics, soccer, swimming, basketball, bowling, diving, softball and figure skating.

The Olympic-themed atmosphere created during this event gives the athletes the feeling that they are a part of the "real thing." This year the Master of Ceremonies was ESPN sportscaster Chris Berman, who delivered an inspirational speech to the athletes.

"Yes, you all want to win, but you have to promise me one thing," Berman said. "OK are you ready to promise? You all have to have FUN! Cherish this moment, make new friends and have fun. And don't forget to thank your coaches and thank your parents."

He emphasized the importance of the Games and the essential element in participation, which is fun.

Golfer Suzy Whaley, who competed in the Empire State Games in 1984 as a skier, brought in the State Games torch.

"Sports teaches us how to win but more importantly it teaches us how to lose," Whaley said. "Winning and losing are not far apart. Winning inspires you for more. Losing is only shameful if you don't participate. Reach higher, work harder. Have no fear!"

I encourage you to find out about your own State Games and get involved. It is a unique experience that you will not forget! ■

Pilates

How to get the most out of this core strength workout

The Pilates method of exercise has become synonymous with core strength. Not surprisingly, many skaters are using this form of exercise as part of their training. Need proof that Pilates can help your skating? During recent high performance evaluations of the top novice and junior skaters from the 2003 State Farm U.S. Figure Skating Championships, the majority who tested well on lower abdominal strength were currently doing Pilates as a supplement to their off-ice training.

history of pilates

Despite the recent surge of interest in Pilates, this highly specialized form of exercise has been around since the 1920s. Joseph Pilates developed the exercise method for himself but utilized it to rehabilitate injured soldiers during World War I.

In the 1950s, Joseph Pilates moved to New York City where he began to train boxers, circus artists, athletes and anyone else who was interested. In the 1970s and 1980s, the dance community, including choreographers George Balanchine and Martha Graham, embraced the Pilates method of exercise. They used it to enhance performance and for rehabilitation of injuries. Dancers were able to remain strong and flexible whether they were on or off stage.

Then Hollywood caught on to the unique qualities of Pilates, which simultaneously increases flexibility and creates strength without adding bulk. Consistent and reproducible results brought rapid attention to the method. Now it is available to everyone almost everywhere.

benefits for figure skaters

Pilates is an ideal method of exercise for skaters because it creates the perfect balance between strength, flexibility and control. As a result, it is a time-efficient workout.

To get the most out of Pilates, you should do a combination of workouts utilizing both the mat exercises and the Reformer or other spring-based Pilates equipment.

Each person will feel something different as a result of doing the exercises. If you are weak, the benefit will be

strength. If you are stiff, the benefit will be flexibility. If you have poor balance, control, posture, and/or core strength, Pilates will help bring better balance to all of these key fitness elements. Pilates can be used as supplemental cardiovascular work only when done at an extremely advanced level.

keeping pilates pure

Since the dissolution of the Pilates trademark in 2000, anyone can use the word Pilates to describe virtually any exercise. Unfortunately, the public is not aware of the dilution of Joseph Pilates' original exercises since the trademark is no longer in force.

For example, stores now sell Pilates balls and Pilates bands although Joseph Pilates never utilized these methods of exercise. Similarly, a 50-minute Pilates mat class at your local exercise gym might not have a single exercise developed by Joseph Pilates.

So how do you know if you are doing the real thing? If your instructor is not doing the following five abdominal series exercises in every mat class, start investigating the instructor's background and look for someone else who has been properly certified.

periodization and rehab

In order to incorporate this form of exercise into your periodization program, one 50-minute Pilates session can be counted as one strength and one flexibility workout. If the jump board is included on the Reformer, check one plyometric training session off your list.

While in season, do not do more than two sessions per week on the Pilates equipment. Off season, one to three sessions is sufficient when trying to balance it with all of the other elements necessary for development of an elite skater.

Pilates is safe and gentle enough to be performed every day yet powerful enough to produce incredible results. So if an injury sidelines you from the ice, do Pilates up to five to six times per week with a combination of two or three private sessions on the equipment and two or three mat classes. The odds are quite high that you will be a better skater when you get back on the ice! In young skaters, Pilates mat exercises help to form a nice strength base prior to the addition of weights or work on the Pilates equipment.

a medical perspective

The latest research on core strength and stabilization points to the transversus abdominus muscle as the key muscle to controlling the spine and preventing back pain and injury. When the transversus abdominus is contracted properly, the lower abdominal wall will draw in rather than bulge out.

Test your natural pattern of movement by laying on your back and placing your hand on your lower abdominal muscles. When lifting your head (as in a partial sit-up), feel whether the stomach draws in or pooches out. If the abdomen pushes out, the superficial muscles such as the

rectus abdominus muscle are working too much and the transverse abdominus is working too little.

When the deep lower abdominal muscles don't work properly, the hip flexor muscles take over. This can be dangerous and lead to back pain since the hip flexor muscles attach directly to and can pull on the low back (lumbar spine). It is therefore important for injury prevention and spinal control to find the transverse abdominus and train it properly.

proper contraction

To find the transverse abdominus, start with an isometric contraction. While lying down, try to pull the lower stomach muscles inward from the hip bones (pelvis) toward the navel. Then try to make the stomach "hollow" by drawing the muscles toward the vertebra of the low back.

Do not push the low back to the floor, only press the muscles toward the spine. Lastly, lift the lower abdomen up and under the rib cage. This is often referred to as "scooping" the stomach up and in. The scooping motion is much like what you do to zip up a tight pair of blue jeans!

Try to maintain this "scoop" of the stomach as you do a partial sit up. At first, you might find it difficult to breathe, but try not to hold your breath.

Once you have mastered the correct pattern of contracting the muscles, try these exercises listed below.

ABDOMINAL SERIES

Whether you are new to Pilates or a devotee, make sure to include these five exercises – the Abdominal Series – into your daily workout routine. All of the following exercises are performed on the back with eyes glancing into the navel and upper body rolled up until just the tip of the shoulder blades touch the floor.

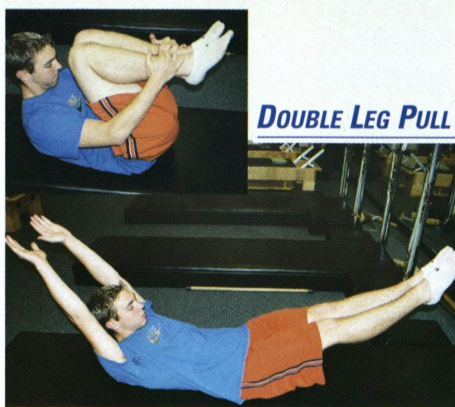
Make sure to keep "scooping" the lower abdomen. If you find the belly bulging during the exercises listed below, take the legs a little higher in the air to improve your control of the deep lower abdominal muscles.

If you find that your low back lifts off the ground, then you are using the hip flexor muscles more than the lower abdominal muscles. And if you continue practicing the exercises improperly, you will train the wrong muscles and likely cause low back or hip pain. To achieve the best results, consult a New York-certified Pilates instructor.

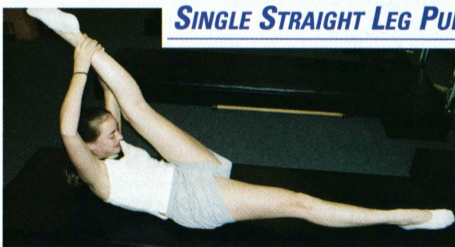
Single Leg Pull



From the starting position mentioned above, pull the right knee in toward your chest so that it is in line with your right shoulder. The right hand should be on the top of the right ankle and the left hand should be on the top of the right knee. Fully supported by the stomach, the other leg should reach long in the air and out of the hip socket. As you change legs, the hands must also switch. Remember that the outside hand always goes to the ankle. The elbows should be lifted up and out. Repeat eight to 10 times on each leg.

**DOUBLE LEG PULL**

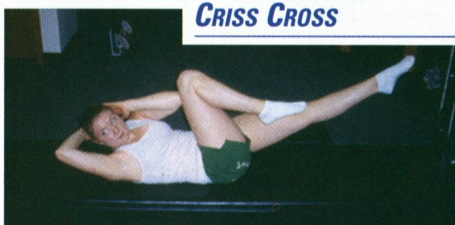
Pull both knees firmly into the chest by grabbing both ankles. Next, extend arms up to frame the face by stretching the arms long by the ears as the legs stretch long away from the body. Start the arms circling down by the side and then pull the knees back in and press them against the chest to assist exhalation. Inhale as you reach the arms and legs long and exhale as you bring the knees into the chest. Repeat five times.

**SINGLE STRAIGHT LEG PULL**

In a scissor like motion, split the legs while both hands grab the top leg with two quick but gentle pulls. Switch legs quickly. Work the split as big as possible without losing control of the stomach. Keep the legs in line with the hip sockets. Repeat eight to 10 times each leg.

**DOUBLE STRAIGHT LEG**

Start with the hands behind the head and both legs up in the air. Lower both legs as low as possible without letting the abdomen protrude or the low back lift off the floor. Then, pull the stomach in even deeper to bring the legs back up in the air. You may only be able to lower your legs a few inches to start. Repeat five times.

**CRISS CROSS**

With hands still behind the head, touch the right elbow to the left knee while the other elbow points behind you. Then switch to the left elbow touching the right knee. Fully supported by the stomach, the other leg reaches long in the air and out of the hip socket. The goal is to make sure that the elbow reaches the knee rather than the knee reaching the elbow. Repeat eight to 10 times each leg.

finding a certified instructor

The key to gaining results with Pilates is proper technique. Since the dissolution of the Pilates trademark, finding a properly trained Pilates instructor is more difficult now than ever before. Properly trained instructors have over 600 hours of training. This helps to ensure safety, a strong knowledge of the method, and the important understanding of modifications for special situations and injuries.

Currently, the best resource for finding New York-trained Pilates instructors is to call 800.4PILATE (800.474.5283). Additional information can be found at www.pilates-studio.com, however this list may not contain the most up to date directory of providers.

Another great resource is the *Pilates Body* by Brooke Siler. This book contains a list of certified instructors and can be used

to supplement and help expand your repertoire of mat exercises for your home workout.

maximize the results

When done properly, doing these exercises every day will enhance your core strength. I have seen many skaters benefit greatly by adding Pilates to their training regime. Take care to ensure that the transverse abdominus muscle is working properly.

Concentrate on the technique described above to maximize your home and studio Pilates workouts. If you have questions, I recommend locating an instructor with proper training and certification who utilizes the pure method as it was originally intended.

Good luck with your Pilates training. I think you will find that incorporating Pilates into a complete off-ice training program will improve your core strength and skating. ■

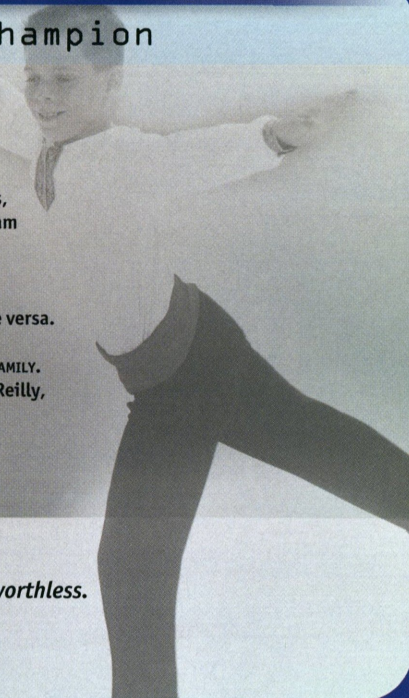
OUTSIDE OF SKATING, WHAT DO YOU MOST LOVE TO DO?

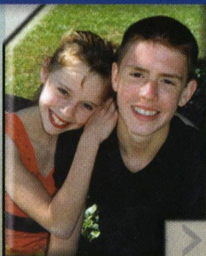

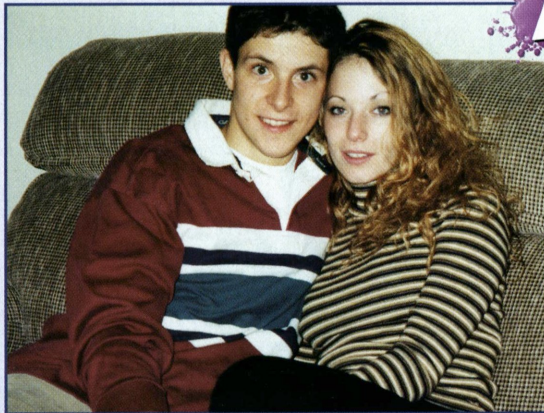

Q How did you know figure skating was for you? MICAELA, 13, HAMDEN

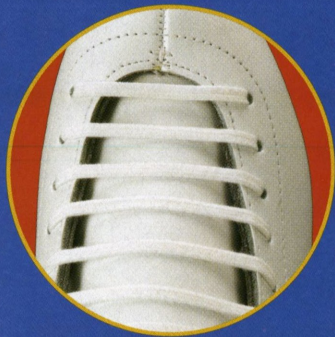

Collegiate skating clubs give back to community

As college students returned to class this fall, two institutions partnered to show how sports can play a positive role in the lives of underprivileged youth. The San Jose State University Ice SC and the Stanford University FSC teamed up to expose these children to college life.

The two skating clubs co-hosted the inaugural Bay Area Outreach Skate at the Belmont Iceland rink on Oct. 4. About 16 sponsors pulled together to host the event.

Twenty-one children from area youth organizations attended the event and more than 50 college students from Stanford and San Jose State came to help.

Jenny Chen, president of Stanford University FSC, said she was pleased with the turnout.

"Looking across the ice during the lessons, I saw youths using their college mentors for support, even though many of the college volunteers had

never formally learned to skate," Chen said.

The day included skating classes taught by members of the Stanford Figure Skating Team and the San Jose State Figure Skating Team, a sports management talk, exhibitions by Stanford competitors Connie Chen and Christina Branom, an open skate and on-ice racing. Plus there was food, music and a raffle. Each child was paired with two college students, one from each university, who mentored them throughout the day.

"We wanted to create an enjoyable atmosphere," Sandy Schaad, president of the San Jose State University ISC explained as one of the reasons for this event, "and many of these children will never have an

opportunity to ice skate, so to be able to incorporate that with other important messages was our main goal."

Chen said she hopes the Bay Area Outreach Skate becomes an annual event. Most of the organizers are graduating, but Chen said they are confident that the

younger skaters in the clubs will continue the event.

Schaad said it's important for the children to be exposed to college life and understand that anyone can attend a university, regardless of their circumstances.

"Most of these kids grow up here yet have never set foot on a college campus," Schaad said. "As a result, [many] never think that they can further their education as well."

The children who attended will have more opportunities to see college life, thanks to the event. They also received free tickets to a San Jose State football game and an invitation to the Stanford Invitational Intercollegiate Figure Skating Competition in January.

"This exposure will hopefully grow into something bigger whether it be a long-term mentorship with a youth or an understanding of children from different walks of life," Chen said.

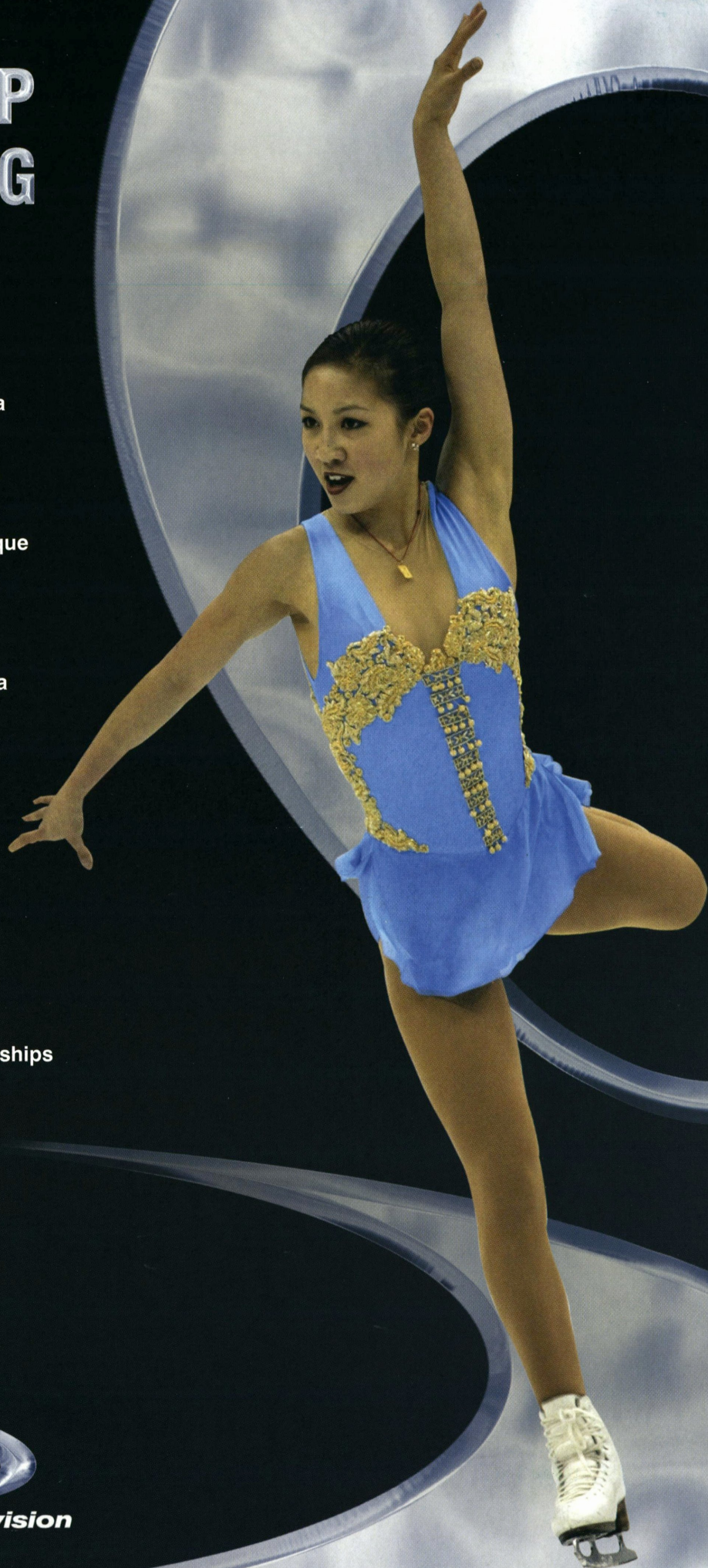

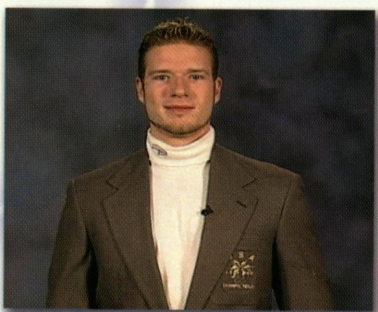
